GREEN STAMPS TO BE VALID FEB. 1

Green stamps K, L, and M in War Ration Book Four will be used by consumers for buying processed foods from February 1 through March 20, the district OPA announced today.

These are the last green stamps on the page, and also the last green stamps that consumers will use for the time being. The new blue stamps, to be used with ration tokens, come into use on February 27.

Between February 27 when the blue stamps become valid and March 20 when the old green stamps run out, consumers may use both sets of stamps for a single purchase. Tokens will be given in change for both colors of stamps.
