HAMMILLS HEAR FROM THEIR SON

The following letter has been received by Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Hammill from their son, Richard L. Hammill, who with his wife and baby have been in internment camps in recent months.

Dear Parents: This note is coming to you via Repatriation boat. We want you to know that we are all well, thanks to the religious section of the Japanese army. All missionaries to the Philippines are now out of internment camps. Our China division workers have been released at Baguio recently for which we are thankful. We have liberty to engage in missionary work here in Greater Manila.

I have been doing quite a little preaching lately, also have lots of time for study. Dena and Roger were interned at Baguio for 108 days. I only 9 days here at Manila. The army brought them here to join me. Twenty-four of us are living here at Phillipine Union college and 36 more in Manila on the compound where we formerly lived. The three of us live and eat with four others, have plenty of native food to eat. No flour, potatoes, milk, etc., except a little for Roger. Do not worry about us, and a merry Christmas to you all.
