### RATIONING CALENDAR

**PROCESSED FOODS**  
Book 4—March 20: Expiration date of green stamps K, L and M. (8, 5, 2, 1-point values). May 20: Expiration date of blue stamps A8, B8, C8, D8 and E8, worth 10 points each.

**MEATS, BUTTER, ETC.**  
Book 3—March 20: Expiration date of brown stamps Y and Z. (8, 5, 2 and 1-point values.)

Book 4—May 20: Expiration date of red stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8 and F8, worth 10 points each. Series A8, B8 and C8 valid now. Series D8, E8 and F8 valid March 12.

**SUGAR**—Book 4  
Sugar stamp 30 valid for 5 pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 31 valid for 5 pounds indefinitely beginning April 1. Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds canning sugar through February 28, 1945.

**SHOES**  
(Loose stamps invalid)  
Book 1—Stamp 18, valid for one pair, expires April 30.  
Book 3—Airplane stamp No. 1, valid indefinitely for one pair. (New stamp to become valid May 1 for one pair.)

**GASOLINE COUPONS**  
(Not valid unless endorsed)  
March 21—Expiration date of No. 10 coupons in A book. (May renew B or C coupons within but not before 15 days from date shown on cover.)

**FUEL OIL**  
March 13—Expiration date of period 3 fuel oil coupons. Period 4 coupons valid February 8 to September 30. Not more than 66 per cent of season's rations should have been used to date.

**TIRE INSPECTION**  
"A" every 6 months (by March 31)  
"B" every 4 months (by Feb. 28)  
"C" every 3 months (by Feb. 28)  
"T" every 6 months or 5,000 miles of driving.
