PROCESSED FOODS
Book 4—Blue stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8 valid indefinitely.
Book 4—Blue stamps F8, G8, H8, J8 and K8 valid April 1, indefinitely.
MEAT, BUTTER, FATS AND CHEESE
Book 4—Red stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8 and F8 valid indefinitely.
Red stamps G8, H8 and J8 valid indefinitely.
Red stamps K8, L8 and M8 valid April 9, indefinitely.
SUGAR
Book 4—Sugar stamp 30 valid indefinitely for 5 pounds.
Sugar stamp 31 valid April 1, indefinitely, for 5 pounds.
For Canning Only—Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through Feb. 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA board for more.
SHOES
Loose Stamps Invalid
Book 1—Stamp 18 valid now to April 30.
Book 3—Airplane stamp No. 1 valid indefinitely.
New shoe stamp valid May 1.

GASOLINE COUPONS
Not Valid Unless Endorsed
"A" No. 11 valid now through June 21—3 gallons each. (May renew "B" or "C" within but not before 15 days from date on cover.)
FUEL OIL
Period 4-5 coupons valid now through September 30.
TIRE INSPECTION
"A" every 6 months; "B" every 4 months; "C" every 3 months; "T" every 6 months or 5,000 miles of driving.

STOVES
Apply at local OPA board for purchase certificate.
WOOD, COAL, SAWDUST
Order your 12-month supply now during temporary winter storage program.

CHECK COOKERS FOR REPAIRS NOW

The advice to shop early and avoid the rush applies just as much to homemakers preparing for canning season as it does to Christmas shoppers, reminds Myrtle Carter, Home Demonstration Agent.
Manufacturers of pressure cookers especially can fill orders for replacements such as gauges, gaskets and safety valve springs much more promptly now than in the rush of the summer season. Manufacturers have been authorized to make 400,000 new aluminum pressure cookers with dial gauges for use this year, which, while

good news, may delay filling of orders for spare parts during the peak of production.
Mrs. Carter recommends examining the cooker to see if all screws and lugs are in good condition, if the pet-cock is working, and if the gauge has had its annual test. The food industries department at Oregon State college is again offering to test these pressure cooker gauges at the usual nominal charge. Just leave them at any Extension Office in the county.
Mrs. Carter adds that the pressure cooker may well be examined to see that the safety valve spring releases steam at around 20 pounds pressure, that the ball is free of corrosion, that handles are secure, and that gaskets, if any, prevent leakage of steam. A rack for the cooker that will hold pint jars is an added convenience.

Julia offers exciting ways to use eggs!
YOUNG BILL gave me his orders for lunch the other day: "And I'd like three eggs scrambled, please!"
And then I got to thinking about other uses for eggs—and how they can be an important part of every meal, right through the day. Examples:
EGG NESTS FOR BREAKFAST
Toast six 3 1/4-inch rounds of bread on one side. Top toasted side with broiled or fried bacon or ham (these could be omitted if not available). Beat 6 egg whites until foamy; add salt and white pepper, continue beating until stiff but not dry. Pile meringue lightly on toast rounds; with rounded end of egg shell make slight indentation in each meringue; gently slip a yolk into center of each nest. Bake on cookie or baking sheet in moderate oven (350° F.) about 10 minutes or until egg yolk is set. Serves 6.

OMELETTE SUPREME FOR LUNCH
6 eggs 1/4 cup milk
1 tsp. salt 2 tbsps. short-floam
1 tbsp. enriched flour
Beat eggs well; add salt, flour, and milk. Continue beating until light and foamy. Melt shortening in heavy frying pan; pour in egg mixture. As mixture browns on under side, pull outside edges to center of the pan, letting the uncooked mixture run to the edges; continue until all of the mixture is set; cover; cook slowly until set and well browned, about 5 minutes. Uncover; cut one-inch slit on outer edge of opposite sides; fold through center; turn into hot serving platter. Serve immediately plain, or spread with preserves; or sprinkle with cheese. Serves 6.
