Red stamps K8, L8, M8 valid indefinitely beginning April 9.

SUGAR

Book 4—Sugar stamps 30 and 31 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each.
For canning only—Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through February 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA board for more (max. 20 lbs. per person).

SHOES (Loose Stamps Invalid)
Book 1—Stamp 18 valid through April 30.
Book 3—Airplane stamp No. 1 valid indefinitely. New shoe stamp valid on May 1.

GASOLINE COUPONS

(Not valid unless endorsed)
"A" No. 11 valid through June 21—3 gallons each. (May renew "B" or "C" within but not before 15 days from date on cover.)

FUEL OIL

Period 4-5 coupons valid through September 30. Not more than 80 per cent of season's rations should have been used to date.

TIRE INSPECTION

"A" every 6 months; "B" every 4 months; "C" every 3 months; "T" every 6 months or 5,000 miles of driving.
