AAA Deadline Extended

The closing date for making application for payment for conservation practices performed under the 1943 AAA program has been extended until April 30, according to an announcement received by the county AAA committee. This 30-day extension should give all county farmers who have not done so full opportunity to file reports of performance and sign their applications. To date 1510 applications have been completed for county farmers, and about 25 additional farmers are believed to be eligible but have not yet made reports.

NEW RULES FOR AUCTIONEERS

Auctioneers selling used farm machinery are required to submit to the nearest OPA district office a copy of the list of articles to be sold. The report must be filed at least six days in advance of the sale. The requirement is part of Maximum Price Regulation No. 133, which is designed to protect farmers against undue price increase on new and used farm machinery.

Nine classes if used farm equipment are under price control for all types of sales, including auctions. They are: combines, corn binders, corn pickers, farm tractors, hay balers, hay loaders, manure spreaders, side delivery rakes, and combinations of these items with other items of farm equipment when the combination is sold as a unit. Auction prices on

these items may not exceed 85 per cent of the manufacturer's latest list price if less than a year old, and not exceed 70 per cent if more than a year old.
