### RATIONING CALENDAR

**PROCESSED FOODS**  
Book 4—Blue stamps A8 through K8, valid indefinitely.  
MEAT, BUTTER, FATS, etc.  
Book 4—Red stamps A8 through M8 valid indefinitely. Red stamps N8, P8, Q8 valid indefinitely beginning April 23.

**SUGAR**  
Book 4—Sugar stamps 30 and 31 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each. For canning only—Sugar stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through February 28, 1945. Apply at local OPA board for more (max. 20 lbs. per person.)

**SHOES**  
Loose stamps invalid.  
Book 1—Stamp 18 valid through April 30.  
Book 3—Airplane stamp No. 1 valid indefinitely. New stamp valid May 1.

**GASOLINE COUPONS**  
Not valid unless endorsed.  
"A" No. 11 valid through June 21—3 gallons each. (May renew "B" or "C" within but not before 15 days from date on cover.)

**FUEL OIL**  
Period 4-5 coupons valid through September 30. Not more than 82 percent of the season's rations should have been used to date.

**TIRE INSPECTION**  
"A" every 6 months; "B" every 4

months; "C" every 3 months; "T" every 6 months or 5,000 miles of driving.

#### STOVES

Apply at local OPA board for purchase certificate.

**WOOD, COAL, SAWDUST**  
Order your 12-months supply now during temporary winter storage program.

#### PRICE CONTROL

Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at your local OPA board.

#### RENT CONTROL

Housing units rented for first time must be registered by landlords within 30 days.

### RULES FOR GAS BOOKS GIVEN

There is no expiration date on current B. C. R. and E gasoline coupons, according to F. C. McKenzie, chief clerk of the local War Price and Rationing Board. The date listed on these books is the earliest renewal date and unused stamps at that time need not be turned in to the board but used until declared not valid. This, of course, does not apply to A gasoline coupons.

All T coupons for the first quarter that are not used should be turned in to the board.

### EXTRA CANNING SUGAR READY

F. C. McKenzie, chief clerk of the local War Price and Rationing board, requests that persons requesting for extra canning sugar to comply with the regulations. The proper method is to mail No. 37 Spare Stamp to the local office, not No. 37 sugar stamp. Then when proper papers are issued, Stamp No. 40 should be taken to the grocery for the first five pounds.

Mr. McKenzie urges that Spare Stamps be mailed in and not brought to the office.
