### LETTER TO THE EDITOR

For some time now, several of us have known about the precarious condition which our local hospital was facing financially, but have done little about it. The time has come, however, when we as citizens of Hermiston must either come to the front and declare our interest in this essential unit of our public welfare, or face the ultimate loss of hospital facilities.

No time need be spent in trying to justify the need for hospital facilities here in town. There is no argument about that. It is a MUST for our city. There are hundreds of us here in town who owe a great deal to the prompt and efficient care given us in our hour of need.

We have two choices: Support the hospital and maintain it at its best; or, forget its needs and lose it entirely. I, for one, cannot forget it. That is why I appeal to you to help in the securing of additional funds to carry on the work. According to my knowledge of the institution, it requires about \$50 per month more than what is now being taken in from the services performed. When we think of the value derived, this is a small sum, that should easily be assumed by the community. I am willing to organize a fund for this purpose, and several organizations and individuals have already given me their support. This is an URGENT call. Those organizations or individuals who would be interested in aiding in this work should do so at once! All monies received will be given proper receipts, and can be left either at the Methodist parsonage on Third Street, or at the Herald office.
