On July 24, 1847, a pioneer people, seeking sanctuary from a world unfriendly to their faith, found in the valley of the Great Salt Lake a soil of exceptional fertility—robbed of its potential productivity by lack of moisture. Water! Water! That was the need of this parched and barren land. Undaunted, they placed a dam in what is now known as City Creek Canyon and flooded the sunbaked earth, tilled the soil and planted the seeds of grain and potatoes. Thus began irrigation by Anglo-Saxons in America! From that humble beginning has come the reclamation of the deserts and the conversion of sagebrush lands into highly productive agricultural communities.

The production possibilities of the irrigated West are tremendous. More than 20 million acres of irrigated land are now under intensive cultivation and about 7 million acres of land have irrigation works constructed and ready to supply the "liquid gold" but are not now being irrigated for lack of

land leveling, clearing, and drainage. In addition, there is water available for irrigating an additional 22 million acres as well as furnishing supplemental water to more than 11 million acres. The potential feeding power of irrigated land is shown in the fact that 20 million acres of presently irrigated land represent only 3 per cent of the land in farms, yet produce 30 per cent of the West's crop income; and that the per acre value of all crops grown in the United States is \$22.32, while for irrigated crops the figure is \$61.50—nearly three times as great a value for irrigated lands.

Are you checking your milk quality? Milk is a highly perishable product, and although it is practically free from bacteria when secreted, it soon becomes contaminated when exposed to the air. The need for protecting the quality of milk is greatest at this time of the year. Many different kinds of bacteria, most of which are not harmful to the human body, are found in milk and produce acid from the milk sugar causing the milk to sour and coagulate. These bacteria grow rapidly at temperatures of 70 degrees F. or above, and with the advent of warmer weather at this season of the year greater care should be exercised in the cooling process. This cooling process should be done quickly if it is to be appreciably prohibit the growth of the bacteria: the cooling of milk to a temperature of 60 degrees F. or below immediately after milking is very essential to the keeping qualities of the product.

Don't let your milk be wasted—that is a waste of your time and effort as well as waste of food. Pete
