### Down On Mac's Farm

Some interesting figures will help us to visualize our job on the farm as it is related to the "eating public." One adult will eat the following food in one year:

- Milk, adult, 182 qts., child, 365
- Butter ..... 35 lbs.
- Cheese ..... 28 1/4 lbs.
- Vegetables, leafy - yellow 600 lbs.
- Tomatoes ..... 2 bushel
- Potatoes ..... 4 bushel
- Other vegetables (cauliflower, etc.) ..... 175 lbs.
- Dried beans and peas ..... 7 lbs.
- Fruits ..... 180 lbs.
- Eggs ..... 30 dozen
- Meat and poultry ..... 170 lbs.
- Lard, bacon, salt pork ..... 60 lbs.
- Flour and cereals ..... 115 lbs.
- Fats (included in butter - meats) ..... 70 lbs.

Someone asked the other day to have some statements made regarding the brooding and rearing of chickens, so here goes. We all are acquainted with the problem of conservation for victory, and annually, thousands of chickens are lost because of poor handling, poor feeding, poor stock, etc. What can we do in the raising of chickens to keep this loss at a minimum? In outline A, B, C form, here are some pointers:

1. Buy quality chicks from properly pullorum tested stock and order well in advance. Inferior chicks are expensive at any price.
2. Prepare for arrival of chicks by having houses, equipment, and yards cleaned, disinfected, and in readiness before each brood.
3. If brooder house is not stationary, move to clean ground before the chicks arrive. If not movable, maintain a satisfactory permanent sod.
4. Provide a properly working brooder stove of sufficient size to care for the number of chicks raised. Be sure all equipment is adequate. This means the increasing size of equipment as the chicks grow older.
5. Protect feed and water containers to prevent wastage and to improve sanitation.
6. Use a deep, highly absorbent litter and change less frequently. Use crushed corn cobs, shavings, dry saw-

dust, or a good commercial litter of at least 2 inches in depth. Straw alone is not a good litter.

7. Use brooder house to capacity, but don't overcrowd. One-half square foot per each day-old chick; one foot per chick after 4 weeks.

8. Let chicks out of doors to utilize sunshine and green grass.

9. Separate cockerels from pullets at an early age.

10. Move pullets from the brooder house as early as possible to clean green range and avoid contact with older chickens, turkeys and other fowl.

11. Build range shelters from available scrap material giving protection from storms, hot weather, and permitting adequate shelter at night.

12. Confine the pullets to the shelters each night as a means of protection against predatory animals.

13. If disease occurs, obtain an early and accurate diagnosis.

14. Properly dispose of dead chicks by prompt removal from brooder house and burning or deep burial immediately.
