program he will be able to carry. Pete Berg, the chairman of the committee to secure such facilities states that about \$1200 is needed at the start and that to date only some \$400 has been subscribed. Now friends, it's up to you and me to see to it that this long needed support for our livestock is not lost. A few dollars from each of us will secure this service until Dr. Past can get things squared away. Let's not wait for someone to come out to see us, but let's each one of us drop our substantial check in the mail TODAY and have things in A-1 shape by the 5th when Doc arrives.

Successful swine raising begins with sanitation in the farrowing pens. It continues through in the growing range and does not end until the fattening period is completed in the feed lot. A few days before the sow is ready to farrow, clean out the farrowing pen thoroughly and haul the manure and litter away to an open field. But be sure it does NOT go on a field or pasture where the young pigs are to be reared later. Follow this with the customary scrubbing of the entire hog pen. A can of lye in a barrel of water helps as a softening agent.

After scrubbing is completed disinfect well a 2 per cent solution of Dr. Salsbury's PAR-O-SAN. Use a force pump that will spray into all the cracks and crevices. Begin with the ceiling, go down the walls and include the pens, gates, feed troughs and everything about the place because it is important to kill the germs of scours, pneumonia, flu, swine erysipelas and the virus of cholera as well as the worm eggs and skin parasites. A good cleaning and disinfection will do that.

Next, put in about six inches of good clean, dry bedding. With this done, turn your attention to the sow. If weather permits, give the sow a thorough bath from head to hoof using the 2 per solution of PAR-O-SAN. This will help to kill the vermin on the skin, help to kill the infection that localizes about the teats. Wash the udders and teats carefully and scrub the hoofs thoroughly. Then let the sow go into the newly prepared, clean quarters and let her remain there until the pigs are old enough to go out on the range.

When the young pigs are sucklings, one should be particularly careful about cleanliness. Clean out and disinfect every week or ten days, often when necessary. Give the premises a thorough soaking with a 1 per cent PAR-O-SAN solution. When the pigs are old enough to go out on the range,
