Down On Mac's Farm

Last week we were talking about sanitation applied to the raising of pigs. Let us continue the sanitation program this week and relate the subject to the general farm.

It is the function of civilized man to aid nature in the survival of the economically valuable animals and in the destruction of germs, viruses and parasites that prey upon these animals both in the native wild state and in the domesticated environment. By domestication man has taught animals to live together in large herds and

flocks in a density of population impossible under the wild conditions. Sanitation is the instrument man has used to obtain this goal. Without a knowledge of disease germs, without a knowledge of how to destroy these disease germs, and without a knowledge of how to immunize animals against diseases, our present production of tremendously increased numbers of livestock and fowls in our "food for freedom" program would have been impossible.

Litter and other wastes should be disposed of in such a manner that diseases cannot be transmitted to other healthy livestock. Manure pits built as separate buildings or as pits in the ground are desirable, and should be screened to keep out flies. When manure is put into pits it goes through a process of heating and fermentation which kills disease germs and parasites.

The carcasses of dead animals should be burned. Small animals may be wrapped in a piece of paper and put in the stove or furnace like a chunk of wood. When carcasses cannot be burned, they should be buried so deeply that dogs and other scavengers will, and cannot, dig them up.
