SAFETY ON FARM TO BE STRESSED

Oregon will join other states in stressing farm accident prevention through an educational program to make farm people more conscious of the special hazards of agriculture during National Farm Safety week. Set by presidential proclamation for July 23 to 29.

W. A. Schoenfeld, dean and director of agriculture at Oregon State college, has been named state chairman for the week by the National Safety council, which is sponsoring the program in cooperation with the United States department of agriculture and farm organizations. Dean Schoenfeld will open the week in Oregon with a radio talk over station KOAC Monday, July 24, at 12:45 p. m.

Citing what he termed "an appalling" loss of life and limb from farm accidents, President Roosevelt has requested all persons and organizations concerned with agriculture and farm life "to stimulate among farmers a full realization of the need for constant attention to the old familiar precautions against the hazards of their calling and also to awaken in them a sense of responsibility for the proper

instruction in rules of safety of the many young and inexperienced persons now being employed on farms."

Easy Ways to Quench Thirst

ON A HOT JULY day, everybody feels like tipping up a whole bucketful of cool thirst-quencher! But there are simpler and far more interesting ways to do it. For instance:

Iced Tea and Iced Coffee—the important things to remember, of course, are that both tea and coffee should be brewed in double strength, and must be freshly made, if you want good flavor when they're iced.

Orange Egg Milk Shake is satisfying and easy to make: combine 1 1/2 cups each of chilled orange juice and milk in a shaker or mason-type glass jar; add 1 egg (slightly beaten), 3 tbsps. sugar and 1 tsp. grated orange rind; put lid on jar and shake well.

For Children, make "Singing Sam Sticks" by pouring fruit-flavor carbonated beverage into refrigerator freezing tray; after about 1 hour's freezing, insert wooden meat skewer into each cube and continue freezing until solid; serve as lollipops.

Coffee Cool is delicious for dessert, or with a midday sandwich: half-fill tall glass with shaved ice; add scoop vanilla ice cream, and fill nearly to top with steaming hot coffee; stir until smooth and frothy.

However you do it, have plenty of thirst-quenchers on hand for your family these July days—helps to keep them healthy and happy!
