

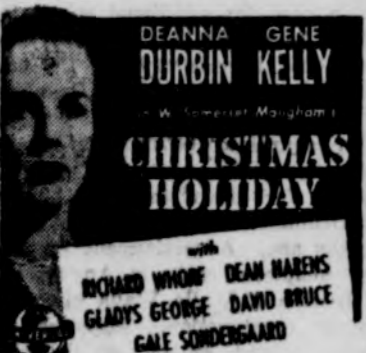

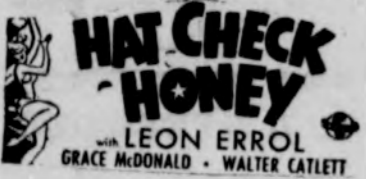

*Shoes; Loose Stamps Invalid*  
Book 3—Airplane stamps Nos. 1 & 2 valid indefinitely.

*Gasoline Coupons; Not Valid Unless Endorsed*  
"A" No. 12 valid through September 21, 3 gallons each.

*Fuel Oil*  
Period 4-5 coupons valid through September 30. Fill your tanks now!

*Tire Inspection Records*  
Must be presented for gasoline applications.
