**AGENT TELLS OF  
LEAF HOPPER BUG**

(Virginia Creeper) Leaf Hopper—these sucking insects are extremely abundant and injurious to Virginia Creeper here in Hermiston this year, according to Frank E. Hackler, assistant county agent. If your vines are assuming a white flecking and parched in appearance, then it is pretty sure they are affected by the leaf hopper. The adult hopper is about one-eighth inch in length, yellowish, and marked by brown specks.

soapy water or use nicotine sulphate spray, rate of 1 teaspoon in one gallon of water plus 1 oz. of soap (or heaping tablespoonful of soap powder). Sprays should be sprayed upward on the under side of the leaves. These sprays are quite effective, but should not be applied when the temperature is below 70 degrees F. to obtain the maximum results.
