## ROCKET GUN GETS THREE PLANES

The aircraft rocket gun of the Ordnance Department, Army Service Forces, is doing some remarkable feats against the enemy.

Colonel A. S. Buyers, Commanding Officer, Umatilla Ordnance Depot, said that probably the most interesting was one that recently happened in the China-Burma-India theatre of operations. Several of our planes were out on a mission. Returning to their base, they flew through a dense cloud formation and one of the planes became separated from the rest. When the pilot emerged from the clouds, there were four Zeros waiting for him. He let one rocket fly and it made a direct hit on one of the Zeros and blew it apart. While attempting to avoid the debris, two of the remaining Zeros collided and crashed. The other Zero fled. The pilot was credited with downing three Zeros with one shot, a very creditable performance.

## RATIONING CALENDAR

Processed Foods—Book 4. Blue stamps A8 through L5 valid indefinitely.

Meat, Butter, Fats and Cheese—Book 4. Red stamps A8 through G5 valid indefinitely; Spare stamp 25 valid exclusively for 10 points lamb through October 21.

Sugar—Book 4. Sugar stamp 30, 31, 32 and 33 valid indefinitely for 5 pounds each; Sugar stamp 40 valid through February 28, 1945, for 5 pounds home canning only; For more canning sugar, apply local board, using spare stamp 37.

Shoes—Loose stamps invalid. Book 3. Airplane stamps 1 and 2 valid indefinitely.

Gasoline Coupons—Not valid unless endorsed. "A" No. 12 valid through September 21. "A" No. 13 valid September 22. Apply by mail to local boards now for renewal, attaching back cover of "A" book. Blanks available at service stations.

Fuel Oil—Period 4-5 coupons valid through September 30. New period 1 coupons valid now.

Tire Inspection Records—Must be presented for gasoline applications.

Stoves—Apply at local OPA board for purchase certificates. Wood, Coal, Sawdust—Delivery by priorities based on written statement of needs.

Price Control—Report overcharges to price clerk at local OPA board. Rent Control—Petitions now being received in all area rent offices under "peculiar circumstances" amendment.

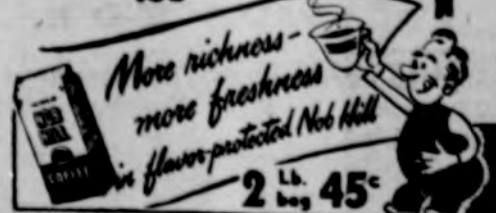
