To amend Section 2, Chapter 1 of the City of Umatilla, Oregon, by including within, annexing to and extending the boundaries of said city to include the following described tract, to-wit:

The exterior boundaries of which are described as follows: From a point 1563.95 ft. South 0° 47' East from the ¼ corner common to Sections 8 and 17, Township 5 North, Range 28, E. W.
