**FEWER CARS ARE NOW AVAILABLE**

There are 1,500,000 fewer motor vehicles on the nation's highways to provide essential transportation through the coming winter than there were at this time last year. Secretary of State Bob Farrell said today in warning drivers to prepare for the nearing months of snow, ice and heavy rains. While every car still functioning is a year older, it is more vital to wartime civilian economy than ever before.

The annual reminder to drivers is being issued early this year, Far-

rell said, both because of this reduction in the nation's irreplaceable stock of automobiles, and because of a sharp increase in last winter's mileage death rate over the previous winter.

"Traffic accidents annually take a heavy toll in Oregon during the winter months of November and December," Farrell said. "During the past five years, 17 percent of all traffic fatalities occurred during these two months. The mileage death rate in Oregon last December was 15.9 persons killed per one hundred million miles travel. In December of 1942 it was 16.4. These rates are nearly double the rates for other months."

**RATIONING CALENDAR**

**Processed Foods**—Blue stamps A8 through Z3 and A5 through R5 valid indefinitely.

**Meat, Butter, Cheese**—Book 4: Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through K5 valid indefinitely.

**Sugar**—Book 4: Sugar stamps 30-31-32-33 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each. Sugar stamp 40 valid through February 28, 1945, for 5 pounds home canning only. For more canning sugar, apply local board using spare stamp 37.

**Shoes**—Loose stamps invalid. Book 3: Airplane stamps 1-2 valid indefinitely. Airplane Stamp No. 3 valid November 1.

**Gasoline Coupons**—Endorse new coupons before using. "A" 13 expires December 21. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.

**Stoves**—Apply local board for purchase certificates for oil, gas stoves.

**Wood, Coal, Sawdust**—Delivery by priorities based on written statement of needs.

**Fuel Oil**—Current coupons valid through August 31, 1945. Not more than 6% of season's rations should have been used to date.

**Price Control**—Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.

**Rent Control**—All rented dwelling units must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.

**OPA EYES DEER HUNTERS GAS USE**

Many deer hunters suspected of using gasoline unlawfully this season will shortly receive notice to appear before their local OPA boards and asked to explain their travels. Sol Stern, OPA enforcement attorney, revealed today.

Stern reported that license numbers of 329 cars are being sent to local boards for investigation and appropriate action. Under direction of Roth Keller, the investigators took the numbers of cars found so far from their home bases that in most instances the trip could only have been made with occupational gasoline, Stern explained.

In almost every instance, the investigators found that motorists making the return trip still had too many "A" coupons left to have made the trip on other than "B" or "C" gasoline allotments. Many were thought to be using "B", "C" and even "T" coupons or had pooled their "A" allotments, all in violation of OPA regulations.
