### KAKTUS KIDS NAME OFFICERS

The Kaktus Kids, an Ordnance Youth club sponsored by the Ordnance city council and USO, named new officers at their quarterly election this week. Committees for the various club activities will be appointed at the next meeting.

### WOMEN CAN 'MINE' MUCH TIN

Women of Umatilla county can "mine" tin sufficient for 96 Flying Fortresses this year. These figures were compiled by J. A. Stewart, vice president of the American Can Company, on the basis of canned foods consumed by civilians in the county during 1943. On the basis of last year's consumption, civilians will open 2,319,276 cans of food this year, he said. According to a table recently issued by Washington, 24,000 cans provide tin sufficient for one Flying Fortress. Meanwhile, the armed forces consumed approximately three billion cans of food during '43 and needs for the current year are expected to rise to three and a quarter billion cans, Mr. Stewart said. He pointed out that with a greatly increased number of the armed forces in overseas duty, more canned foods will be needed because the can has proved the most practical container for the shipment of foods abroad.

The regular meeting of the Umatilla P. T. A. was held Tuesday, November 14. Following a short business session, Rev. H. V. McGee of Hermiston gave an address on the subject, "After the War—What About Youth?" At the close of the evening, the junior mothers served pumpkin pie and coffee.

### RATIONING CALENDAR

**Processed Foods**—Blue stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through W5 valid indefinitely.

**Meat, Butter, Cheese**—Book 4: Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through P5 valid indefinitely.

**Sugar**—Book 4: Sugar stamps 30 through 33 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each. Sugar stamp 34 valid through February 16 for five pounds. Sugar 28, 1945, for 5 pounds home canning only.

**Shoes**—Loose stamps invalid. Book 3: Airplane stamps 1-2-3 valid indefinitely.

**Gasoline Coupons**—Not valid unless endorsed. "A" 13 expires December 21. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.

**Stoves**—Apply local board for purchase certificates for oil, gas stoves.

**Wood, Coal, Sawdust**—Delivery by priorities based on written statement of needs.

**Fuel Oil**—Current coupons valid through August 31, 1945. Not more than 10% of season's rations should have been used to date.

**Price Control**—Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.

**Rent Control**—All rented dwelling units must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.

### NEW STAMP FOR SUGAR IS VALID

Sugar stamp 34 in war ration book 4 will be good for buying five pounds of sugar beginning November 16, 1944. Willard Case, district OPA food rationing representative, announced today.

Like sugar stamps 30, 31, 32 and 33, the new stamp will be good indefinitely for buying 5 pounds of sugar, Case explained. Since March 16, 1943, the OPA has been validating one sugar stamp—good for 5 pounds—every two and one-half months, he said.

Sugar stamp No. 40, validated February 1, 1944, is good for buying 5 pounds of home canning sugar through February 28, 1945.

**A New way to Carve**

After the turkey, roasting chicken, or other large fowl has been brought to the table on a platter, breast up and with the legs pointing to the right or left (depending on whether the carver is right or left-handed), the carver turns the turkey on its side so the back is toward him. Then he removes the drumstick by grasping the outer end and pulling gently while the knife cuts through the joint, separating it from the thigh.



Then the carver places the drumstick on a side plate, holding it upright, and slices its meat off, carving parallel with the bone. Next, he cuts thin slices from the thigh, continuing until the thigh bone itself is exposed. Then he loosens the meat on each side of the thigh bone with tip of his knife, and removes the bone with tines of fork. Remaining thigh meat is sliced off while still attached to the bird.



Slicing breast meat with the grain, the carver takes lengthwise slices from the breast and wing until wing-to-body joint is exposed. Fork is established in wing, and wing is unjointed from body with knife. Thin lengthwise slices are removed until all white meat has been carved from this side of the bird. (All meat, of course, is placed on the side dish as it is cut.)



To get at the dressing, the thin skin under the thigh is slit with tip of the knife, making an opening large enough to allow entrance of serving spoon. "Getting at" the dressing is much simplified by this method.
