RATIONING CALENDAR

Processed Foods—Blue stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through W5 valid indefinitely.

Meat, Butter, Cheese—Book 4: Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through P5 valid indefinitely.

Sugar—Book 4: Sugar stamps 30 through 34 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds each. Sugar stamp 40 valid through Feb. 28, 1945, for 5 pounds home canning only.

Shoes—Loose stamps invalid. Book 3: Airplane stamps 1-2-3 valid indefinitely.

Gasoline Coupons—Not valid unless endorsed. "A" 13 expires December 21. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.

Stoves—Apply local board for purchase certificates for oil, gas

Fuel Oil—Period 4 and 5 coupons (1943-44 series) and period 1 coupons (1944-45 series) valid through August 31, 1945. Not more than 14% of season's rations should have been used to date.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"SOUL and Body" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, November 19.
