### CAREFUL AUTO DRIVING URGED

Be Alive in Forty-Five!  
With that slogan, Secretary of

State Robert S. Farrell today urged Oregon drivers and pedestrians to exercise care during the New Year's day observance to assure avoidance of death and injury in holiday traffic as the year ends. "Traffic accidents have a ten-

dency to slope upward as the year closes, due to inclement weather, longer hours of darkness and holiday observance," Farrell said.

"With our nation requiring every effort to maintain war production, we certainly can ill afford unnecessary traffic casualties. And they are unnecessary because they can be avoided through the exercise of ordinary care and common sense."

Farrell reminded Oregonians that New Year's day traffic accidents claimed a toll of four lives at the start of 1944.

Processed Foods—Book 4: Blue stamps X5 through Z5, and A2-B2, valid indefinitely. Blue stamps C-2 through G-2 valid Monday, January 1.

Meat, Butter, Cheese — Book 4: Red stamps Q5 through S5 valid indefinitely. Red stamps T-5 through X-5 valid on Sunday, December 31.

Sugar—Book 4: Sugar stamp 34 valid indefinitely, 5 pounds.

Gasoline Coupons — Not valid unless endorsed. "A" 14 expires March 21, 1945. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.

Stoves—Apply local board for

oil, gas stove certificates.

Wood, Coal, Sawdust—Delivery by priorities based on needs.

Fuel Oil—Period 4 and 5 coupons (1943-44 series) and period 1 and 2 coupons (1944-45 series) valid through August 31, 1945. Not more than 32 per cent of season's

ration should have been used to date.

Price Control—Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.

Rent Control—All rented dwelling units must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.
