

**RATIONING CALENDAR**

**Processed Foods**—Book 4: Blue stamps X5 through Z5, and A2 to G2 now valid. Blue stamps H2, J2, K2, L2 and M2 valid February 1.  
**Meal, Butter, Cheese** — Book 4: Red stamps Q5 through Z5 and A2 through D2 now valid.  
**Sugar**—Book 4: Sugar stamp 34

valid for 5 pounds. New sugar stamp 35 is valid February 1 for 5 pounds.  
**Shoes**—Loose stamps invalid. Book 3: Airplane stamps 1-2-3 valid indefinitely.  
**Gasoline Coupons** — Not valid unless endorsed. "A" 14 expires March 21, 1945. Each coupon worth 4 gallons.  
**Stoves**—Apply local board for oil, gas stove certificates.

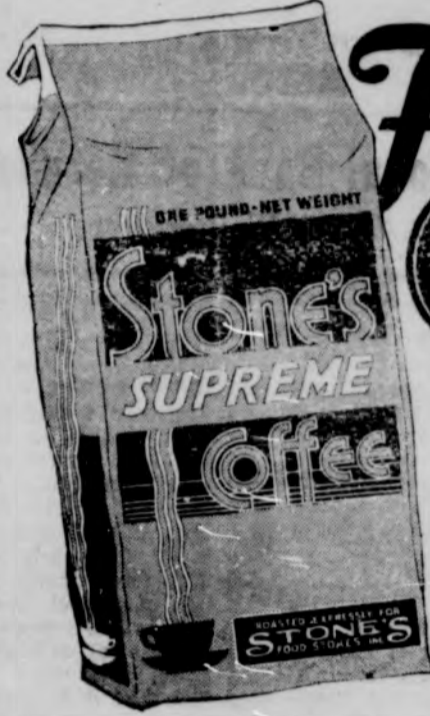
**Wood, Coal, Sawdust**—See your fuel dealer for priority on delivery.  
**Fuel Oil**—Period 1 & 2 coupons valid through August 31. Not more than 51 per cent of season's rations should have been used to date.  
**Price Control**—Refer inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.  
**Rent Control**—All rented dwelling units must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.
