FARM MEETING TO BE FEB. 16TH

The monthly meeting of the Umatilla Project Farm Bureau will be postponed one week to Friday evening, February 16, due to conflict with the date of the annual Farm Bureau Co-operative meeting to be held Friday, February 9. H. K. Dean, superintendent of the U. S. Field station will speak on gardening and practices as applicable to the local soils and conditions. Mrs. A. E. McFarland, recently returned from a National REA convention, where she represented the local organization, is being contacted and if possible she will be present and relate some of the highlights of the convention, which should interest all REA users in the area.

An Economic Conference, patterned after the pattern of a like meeting held in Hermiston in February, 1926, is again contemplated.

Subjects covered in the 1929 conference were poultry, farm crops, livestock, bee keeping, dairying, truck crops, pastures and project economies. This session lasted two days and was participated in by business men, bankers, farmers and county agents, and a staff of state college extension workers. The recommendations of the conference were immeasurably valuable and continued to be for several years, a guide to farming operations on irrigated lands of the west end.

Much time is required in preliminary preparations for these conferences, it is said, and the holding of the actual conference would probably be timed with closing of the war.
