#### HAROLD H. NEILL IS HONORED

Included among eighty-five members of the crew of a U. S. aircraft carrier in the Pacific who have been awarded letters of commendation by their commanding officer in recognition of their meritorious service and devotion to duty is Harold H. Neill, Aviation Ordnanceman second class, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Neill of Echo, Oregon. Neill attended Hermiston high school. He enlisted in the Navy on May 14, 1942, and received training at San Diego, Cal. He has served 16 months on a carrier.

From March to November, 1944, the ship to which he is attached has been in continuous combat operations against the enemy. It participated in all the major carrier strikes and engagements of this period. The men commended were selected by their division officers for this special recognition because of their zeal, loyalty and commendable performance of duty under most difficult and hazardous conditions.

#### POWER RATES LOWER THAN TVA

Homes served by Pacific Power & Light Company now pay a lower average price per kilowatt-hour for electricity than prevails in the area served by the \$750,000,000 Tennessee Valley Authority, it was reported by Paul B. McKee, president of the local company, in his February letter to stockholders.

The company's average for this class of service dropped to only 1.86 cents a kilowatt-hour in 1944, McKee reported, as compared with 1.88 cents for public distributors of TVA power. The decrease was credited to the \$600,000 paid to customers in "rate dividends" during the year.
