Don't ask your Social Security Board field office for a statement of your 1944 earnings for income tax purposes, Vernon A. Welo, manager of the La Grande field office requested this week. Mr. Welo, who was in Hermiston Tuesday, also stated that anyone 65 or over who would like to know of his status regarding old age and survivors insurance write him at La Grande.

The Social Security Board cannot help you because your employer's tax return will not have reached the Board in time to permit it to make available a statement of your annual earnings for

income tax returns.

Manager Welo also said that each year, "come income tax time", hundreds of Oregonians request statements of their annual earnings for use in making out income tax returns, because they know that the Social Security Board keeps careful records of wages paid to workers in jobs covered by the old-age and survivors insurance system. It is on the basis of these records that benefits are calculated for the insured worker or his family.

Wages paid during the last three months of 1944 will be reported to the Collectors of Internal Revenue during January, Mr. Welo said. During February and March these reports will be forwarded to the Baltimore offices of the Bureau of Old-Age and Survivors Insurance. There the wage amounts will be recorded in the social security account maintained for each individual worker. This will not be completed until the end of June.

LOCAL RESIDENT PASSES AWAY

Mrs. C. W. Belt (Mamie Viola Buck) passed away Monday morning at the Hermiston General hospital following an illness of several months from an incurable disease. Services were held Wednesday at Emmett, Ida., where the body was shipped. Mr. Belt and family, accompanied by Rev. H. V. McGee of the local Baptist church, went to Emmett for the funeral.

Mrs. Belt was born April 27, 1903, at Lenore, Okla., later coming further west, being married at Canyon City, Colo., May 4, 1923. To this union were born six children, one of whom, Russell Alvin, passed away a number of years ago. Those surviving, besides Mr. Belt, are Jimmie F., Courtney Arthur, LaRue Charles, Larry and Louise. Also surviving are two sisters, her father, James A. Buck, a niece and a nephew.

The family came to Hermiston about three years ago. Mr. Belt is employed at the Umatilla Ordnance Depot.
