CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"DOCTRINE and Atonement" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, April 22.

The Golden Text was, "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold all things are become new." (II Cor. 5:17).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement." (Rom. 5:8, 10, 11).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "If Truth is overcoming error in your daily walk and conversation, you can finally say, 'I have fought a good fight . . . I have kept the faith,' because you are a better man. This is having our part in the at-one-ment with Truth and Love." (p. 21).

Crusade Goes Over



CHICAGO — Bishop J. Ralph Magee (left), chairman and director of the Methodist Crusade for Christ, receives news that the goal of \$25,000,000 for postwar relief and reconstruction has been surpassed by more than a million dollars.
Dr. J. Manning Potts, who came from Roanoke, Va., to become Bishop Magee's associate, presents him a summary of reports from the denomination's 600 district superintendents. The total is \$26,040,749. Of this amount 11 million is in cash, represented by pass books in the Bishop's hand. The rest is in pledges payable within the next nine months. This is believed to be the largest sum ever raised by a church for a comparable purpose.
Emphasis will now swing to other aspects of the four-year, five-fold Crusade for Christ: church school attendance, stewardship, evangelism and support of international collaboration.
