BRONZE STAR IS RECEIVED HERE

With the 11th Airborne Division on Luzon (delayed)—Pfc. George C. Russell, husband of Mrs. Georgia M. Russell, Box 621, Hermiston, Ore., has been awarded posthumously the Bronze Star Medal for heroism by the Commanding General of the 11th Airborne Division.

During the fighting on Luzon, Philippine Islands, February 13, he moved forward to an exposed position in the face of enemy fire. Continuing onward, he singlehandedly attacked and neutralized an enemy machine gun position which was holding up the advance of his platoon.

He was mortally wounded in the performance of this heroic deed.

The citation reads: "The great courage, daring initiative and keen determination to close with the enemy displayed by Pfc. Russell set an inspiring example for his unit and exemplify the highest traditions of the military service."
