Phillip Arthur 'Phil' Hawman Hermiston September 1, 1931-January 23, 2015

Phillip Ar-"Phil" thur Hawman passed away Good at Shepherd Medical Center in

Hermiston, Oregon, on Friday, January 23, 2015, after a long battle with Alzheimer's at the age of 83 years. Phil was born in

Whiteson, Oregon, on September 1, 1931. Hawman He attended Amity High School in Amity, Oregon, where his teams won state titles in football and basketball. He was later inducted into the Amity High School Hall of Fame. After high

school, Phil attended Oregon State University, where he graduated with a degree in agricultural education. There he met and married the love of his life for 62 years, Grace Ardele Firestone. After graduation, he joined the United States Air Force, where he served as a pilot for 12 years, retiring with the rank of major.

After leaving the military, Phil and Ardele bought a small farm outside of Dayton, Oregon. Together, they grew a diverse number of crops and a family of five children: Susan, Karen, Linda, Mike and Judy. The farm grew with time and 29 years later, it encompassed 1,200 irrigated acres. Phil was also very involved in the Dayton community. He served as president of the Dayton School Board, director of Norpac, director of the Oregon and Washington Vegetable Growers Association, and was recognized by the FFA for his service to the organization.

In 1982, Phil and Ardele moved the farm to Hermiston, Oregon. They were enticed by center pivot irrigation and encouraged to move by their son, Mike, who was attending Blue Mountain Community College in Pendleton, Oregon. The move was a success. Phil has been recognized six times as one of the best corn growers in the United States. He also developed a new variety of perennial ryegrass seed, labeled "Pavillion," and marketed internationally. Phil spent the last several years of

in the Columbia Basin and has been instrumental in making the crop a thriving option for growers in the region. Farming was Phil's passion,

and he greatly enjoyed working the land. He was inducted into the Oregon State University College of Agricultural Sciences Hall of Fame in 2005.

Phil was also very involved in the Hermiston community. He served as a member of the Hermiston Chamber of Commerce, vice chair of the Hermiston Fire Department, and on the advisory committee of the Hermiston Agricultural Research and Extension Center. Phil was always willing to help a neighbor or someone in need.

Most importantly, Phil was a devoted husband, grandfather, and father. great-grandfather. He is survived by his loving wife, Ardele; five children, Susan Karschnia of Richland, Wash., Karen Blunck of Canby, Ore., Linda Von Borstel of Grass Valley, Ore., Mike Hawman of Hermiston, Ore., and Judy Von Borstel, Grass Valley, Ore.; his brother, Eric Hawman of Schavmburg, Illinois; 16 grandchildren,15 great-grandchildren; and two to-be great-grandchildren.

Phil was preceded in death by his parents, Arthur and Georgia Hawman, and sisters Joyce Rawlings and Artyce Hawman.

A graveside service with military honors will be held on Saturday, January 31, 2015, at 1 p.m. at the Hermiston Cemetery, Hermiston, Oregon.

Charles Martin Lorence Umatilla February 18, 1918 - January 15, 2015

Charles Martin Lorence, 96, of Umatilla, Ore., passed away at the Chaplaincy Hospice House in Kennewick, Wash., Thursday

Jan. 15, 2015. He was born in Silverton, Ore., to Andrew and Marjorie (Hayes) Lor-

ence and was raised on the family farm in the Waldo Hills. Lorence At age 16 he re-

ceived a football injury that left him with a fused hip joint and a left leg 2 inches shorter than his right leg. Following his recovery he was determined that a "short leg" would not define or limit his quality of life. So what if he could not run fast or ride a horse, he could still work harder, longer or smarter than others to accomplish his goals. In 1936 the family moved to Yakima, Wash., where he met and married Kathleen Pollock in July 1940. They enjoyed a 71year marriage and had a son, Robert James, and a daughter, Kathleen May.

Charles was a dedicated family man who believed in a strong work ethic and traditional family values. During the Depression years he worked any job he could find and briefly moved the family to Seattle to work at Boeing prior to going to Alaska to work on the construction of the Alaska Highway as a truck driver and mechanic. Following the end of the war, Charles returned home and served as a truck driver and mechanic, following Turtling around the state of Washington for five years. In 1949, he joined his brother (Bob) and brother-in-law (Al Pollock) to build and operate ABC Service Station and Garage in Umatilla, Ore.

In 1973 they sold the resort and spent the next 38 years salmon fishing at the mouth of the Columbia River and Alaska as well as traveling throughout the U.S. and

Canada in their travel trailer. Ultimately they became "snowbirds," spending 38 winters at Good Life RV Resort in Mesa, Arizona. In 1999 they returned to Umatilla to spend their summers near their extended family. Charles was revered by numerous nieces and nephews who enjoyed his numerous stories of life on the farm, the Depression era, fishing and working in the North Country as well as his many lectures on life in general that always ended with "work hard, save your money and pay your taxes.'

Charles was preceded in death by his parents, his wife of 71 years, Kathleen, and his brother Robert Andrew. He is survived by his sister Ruby Snoey; his son Robert James and wife Judith; daughter Kathleen McManus and husband Thomas; grandchildren Jon Charles Lorence and wife Tricia, Robert Alexander Lorence and wife Dee, and Jennifer Westling and husband Craig; and seven great-grandchildren. He took special pleasure in giving his grandchildren lectures dealing with ethics, family values and the benefits of higher education and saving their money.

William Roy Ford Jr. Hermiston May 17, 1932-January 25, 2015


