Law enforcement targeting drunk drivers during the Super Bowl

Law enforcement agencies will be increasing patrols Super Bowl Sunday to prevent incidents caused by impaired drivers.

According to a press release from the Umatilla County Sheriff's Office, extra deputies will be patrolling Sunday to increase safety.

"Historically, Super Bowl Sunday is associated with high alcohol consumption," Sgt. Josh Roberts said in the release. "We want to encourage people to enjoy the game, but do so responsibly. If you're going to drink, plan ahead and use a designated driver."

According to an Oregon State Police press release, OSP and local police departments will also be targeting impaired drivers.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administra-

tion reports that impaired drivers contribute to Super Bowl Sunday being one of the most dangerous days on the road: Nationwide, approximately 48 percent of traffic fatalities involve a driver or motorcycle operator with a blood alcohol concentration of .08 percent or higher.

OSP recommends choosing a sober designated driver before drinking and offers tips for people attending or hosting parties.

For people going out:

- Designate a sober driver before the party begins.
- Avoid drinking too much alcohol too fast. Eat plenty of food, take breaks and alternate with non-alcoholic drinks.
- Make sure your ride is sober before letting him or her drive you.
- If you don't have a

designated driver, ask a sober friend for a ride home, call a cab, friend or family member to come and get you or, if possible, stay where you are for the night and don't drive until you are sober.

- Use your community's sober ride program.
- Never let a friend drive drunk. Arrange a safe way for them to get home.
- Always buckle up.

It's still your best defense against other drunk drivers.

If you are hosting a Super Bowl party:

- Make sure all of your guests designate their sober drivers in advance or help arrange ride-sharing with sober drivers.
- Serve plenty of food and non-alcoholic beverages at the party.
- If you plan to stay sober, offer to drive guests

home.

- Encourage guests to pace themselves.
- Host your party like they do at the stadium. Stop serving alcohol at the end of the third quarter of the game. The fourth quarter is perfect for serving coffee and dessert.
- Keep the phone numbers of local cab companies on hand, and take the keys away from anyone who is thinking of driving drunk.
- Remember, you can be held liable and prosecuted if someone you served ends up in a drunk-driving crash.
