Umatilla County Fair announces this year's headlining entertainment

The Umatilla County Fair announced its headlining entertainment for the 2015 fair season, which includes several popular performers.

The fair runs Aug. 11 through Aug. 15 and all main stage entertainment will perform on the Wildhorse Resort and Casino Main Stage.

Country artist Dustin Lynch will kick off the week and will perform Aug. 11. His self-titled debut hit was No. 1 on Billboard's Top Country Albums chart, making him the only new male artist to achieve such a feat that year. His album's lead single, "Cowboys and Angels," exceeded platinum sales status. This fall, he returns with his sophomore album, "Where It's At."

Aug. 12, country singer John Michael Montgomery will take the stage. He has had 15 No. 1 singles and has racked up sales of more than 18 million records during his career. He has received three Grammy nominations, two Country Music Awards and two Billboard Country Singles of the Year.

On Aug. 13, the fair will again feature a Latino night, with performers who have yet to be announced.

On Aug. 14, the rock band

Hinder will take the stage. Their single "Lips of an Angel" shot them to stardom. The band has toured with Motley Crue, Nickelback, Aerosmith and Papa Roach. The band's fifth studio album, "When the Smoke Clears," is set for release this spring.

On Aug. 15, the '80s and '90s rock band Warrant will perform. Warrant's five albums have sold more than 10 million copies internationally. One of

its singles, "Heaven," reached No. 1 in Rolling Stone and No. 2 on the Billboard Hot 100.

There are 400 reserved seats available for each concert, which are \$12 each. They go on sale at 8 a.m. March 16 at the Umatilla County Fair office, 515 W. Orchard Ave., which is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. Tickets cannot be purchased via phone prior to that date.

Patricia A. "Pat" Rebman was born on March 23, 1942, in Bonners Ferry, Idaho, to parents Edwin and Sarah Griggs Cripe. She died on February 1, 2015, surrounded by her family at her home in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age of 72 years.

Pat was raised in Troy, Montana, until moving to Pendleton, Oregon, in 1956 and then to Hermiston, Oregon, in 1958. She graduated from Hermiston High School in the class of 1960. Pat was united in marriage to Rick Rebman on April 16, 1960, in Hermiston. They lived in Klamath Falls, Oregon, and Pendleton for a short time before returning to Hermiston, Oregon, in 1967 where they have lived since.
