Pistol turns out to be BB gun

Officers dismiss 17-year-old male without charges after'stern lecture'

Hermiston police responded to a report of a juvenile carrying a pistol Friday morning in Hermiston but let the individual go with a warning after discovering it was a BB gun.

According to the Hermiston Police Department media bulletin, at about 7 a.m., a 911 caller reported seeing a juvenile walking north on Northwest Seventh Street near Butte Park carrying what appeared to be a black pistol.

Police Chief Jason Edmiston said officers finally located the 17-year-old male near the intersection of Elm Avenue and Highway 395 and determined the pistol was a BB gun.

'Officers gave a stern lecture to the individual and sent him on his way," Ed-

miston said. "Unfortunately, this is one of those areas where it can get muddy for an officer to define 'public alarm' — one component of disorderly conduct. If the individual was waving the gun around, a case could probably be made, but that was not the case in this instance."

Edmiston said, although Butte Park, where the individual was first reported, is near Rocky Heights Elementary School, HPD received no information that the teen was on school property.


U.S. Navy Band quintet to perform
