lem at each of the schools is they have significantly more exterior doors than what he would recommend for the square footage. He said Rocky Heights has 29 exterior doors and Highland Hills, 35, compared with newer campuses, such as West Park Elementary School or Armand Larive Middle School, which have about 13 doors on their significantly larger campuses.

Edmiston said because each school has so many access points, it would be difficult for police to contain or secure the schools from an intruder or other threat.

Edmiston said his other concern is the two buildings both have outdoor hallways, which also make them harder to secure from a tactical standpoint if a serious event were to take place.

"One thing that really stood out to me was the access onto the property and access off," he said at a previous board meeting.

Edmiston said he recommends either serious modification to the buildings or demolition and reconstruction of the build-


