CASAs are trained volunteers who advocate for children in foster care to find a safe, permanent home.

"There are over 100 children in Morrow and Umatilla Counties that are not served by CASA," Rome said. "There is a great need for additional funding to train and recruit more vol-


The breakfast of all-youcan-eat pancakes costs \$5 per person, and festivities also include face painting, an Easter craft project and Easter egg hunt.
