Cardenas runs away from field

Zitterkob, McCarty also win events

As he closed the back stretch of the 1,500-meter run at the Dick Horyna Invitational Saturday in Stanfield, Umatilla's Fabian Cardenas fought against the wind.

The cross wind, gusting up to 30 mph, forced the defending state champion to adjust his strategy around the track, but it didn't affect his result.

'When the wind's in your face, it makes you feel heavy," Cardenas said. "I train in the wind like twice a week on my long runs. What I do when the wind's in my face, I tend to throw on some surges, just so I can stay at the pace I want to be at."

The junior finished his 1,500-meter domination in 4 minutes, 13.76 seconds, a whopping 44 seconds better than Bickleton's Andrew Gannon, who finished second. Stanfield's Carlos Flores took third in the event, clocking a 4:41.03

As a team, Umatilla finished seventh in the boys meet, accumulating 32 points. Goldendale won with 107. Stanfield earned 30 points for eighth, and Echo earned five points for 22nd. On the girls side, Echo garnered 42 points, good for sixth place, Stanfield had 25 points to take 11 place and Umatilla came up with 16 points, placing the Vikings

In his lone event of the day, the 1,500, Cardenas took the whole shot and never relinquished it. After the first lap, his lead was already sizable, and it only increased.

By the time he finished, he was the only runner on the back straight.

"I'm pretty happy. It feels pretty good," Cardenas said of his performance on Sat-

Cardenas, though, was just one of hundreds of athletes who dealt with the wind.

In her first 400-meter sprint of the season, Stanfield's Bailey Watson had to run into the wind. She finished six seconds off the pace of Goldendale's Ocean Bryant (1:12.43), but Watson was pleased with where she finished the day, considering the conditions.

Echo's Devyn Tarvin finished second in 1:09.93.

"I did better than I thought I was going to do," Watson said shortly after her race.

She said, when running in the wind, runners have to change their body positions at certain parts of the track, such as keeping their chins down and leaning into the wind. Otherwise, she said, the wind will lift a runner's torso and slow the person down significantly.

tilla's Amie Zitterkob won the girls 100-meter sprint in 11.83, and teammate Miguel Madrigal took second in the boys 100-meter in 11.84. Madrigal also finished third in the 200-meter in 24.22. Echo's Taylor Swaggert finished fourth in the girls 200 meters, clocking a time of 28.56.

Stanfield's Hunter Braithwaite was the runner-up in the boys 400-meter sprint, finishing in 56.99, two seconds behind Brian Golding of Goldendale. Berenice Chavez of Umatilla took third in the girls 1,500-meter, finishing in 5:30.26.

Jenny Garcia from Stanfield took third in the 300 meters, notching a time of 14:32.39.

Echo's Elizabeth Mc-Carty won the girls javelin throw with a toss of 107 feet, nearly 21 feet better than runner-up Rachel Holland from Ione. Braithwaite also placed third in the boys long jump, leaping 19-

07, just two inches behind co-winners Dylon Tankersley of Mitchell-Spray and Kaden Clark from Heppner.

way) and headed down to Bend for the Chuck Bafaro High Desert Classic. It was a massive tournament with too many teams to count, in like five different age groups. Sometimes in Longview we'd have 16-team tournaments that started on Thursday — so much baseball you can barely handle it.

But those are things of the past. Now, two different age groups play on one weekend. As an umpire, you might have four games on a given Saturday, and two are 12-year-old games

and two are 11-yearold games. There just aren't enough teams to have a full weekend of baseball with just 12-year-olds or just 11-year-olds.

I'm very impressed with the mentality of youth baseball in Hermiston. People want their children to play with their friends. They want to support the local program and have their youth wear "Hermiston" across their chest and bold "H" on their caps.

Though the state of youth baseball where I come from is sad, frustrating and, frankly, alarming, the state of youth baseball in Hermiston is as strong as ever.

In the last five years, enrollment at Hermiston Little League has risen from 560 in 2011 to 611 in 2015. HLL saw a peak in 2013 with 620 enrollees.

I salute you for the growth. Seeing that many children excited to be out for another spring and summer of baseball in their hometown was fun and refreshing. Hopefully that can continue here. I'll sure be rooting for it. I don't want to see the Field of Dreams have the same fate as Central.
