pointing that position. "They felt it could have evolved into cronyism," Hermiston City Manager Byron Smith told the East Oregonian Tuesday evening.

City officials, however, argued appointing the municipal court judge would have made the process more professional and allowed the council to interview candidates and appoint them based on their qualifications.

At a multi-county level, approval of Blue Mountain Community College capital

improvement bond measure was passing, with 52 percent of voters in Umatilla County in favor and 48 percent opposed. In Morrow County, the capital improvement project measure was also passing, according to early, unofficial results, with 875 votes in favor and 794 against. By passing, taxpayers would be assessed

25 cents per \$1,000 to construct an approximately \$23 million capital project that includes building a Center for Precision Irrigated Agriculture in Hermiston.

The proposal included on Tuesday's ballot was an amended version of a capital improvement project measure that voters failed to approve in May 2014.

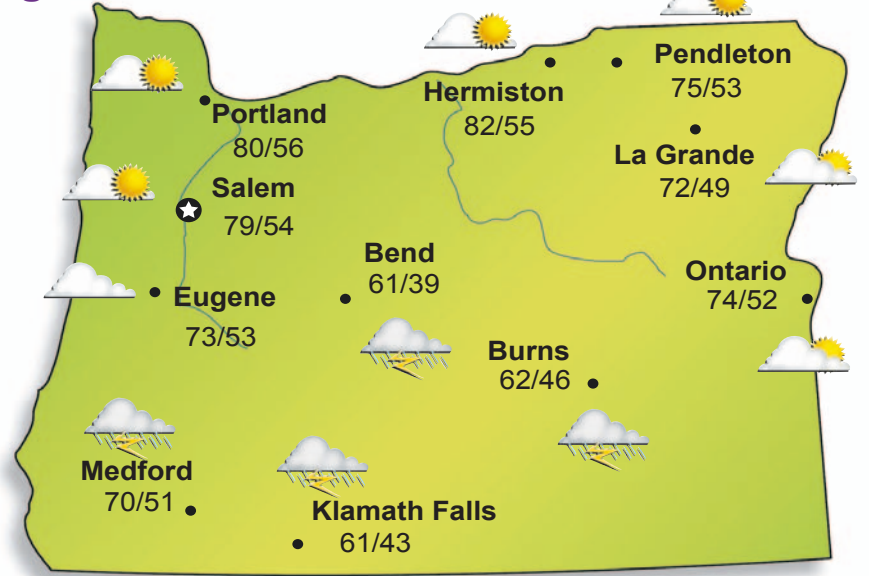

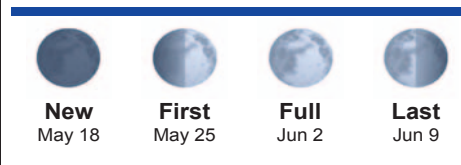

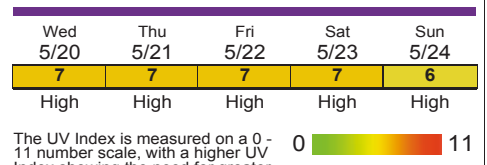
