### Enrollment open for Echo Preschool

The Echo School District will again offer a full-day preschool program for 4-year-olds for the 2015-2016 school year. The program is designed to provide working families, who would otherwise not have a preschool option in the area.

Enrollment for the preschool is open now. There will be a preschool open house and informational meeting at 6 p.m. Tuesday, with the opportunity to meet the teacher. The preschool is across the street from Echo High School.

Echo Preschool has the following options:

- Before-School Program, 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m., cost \$25 per month
- Traditional All-Day Class, 8:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m., cost \$400 per month
- After-School Program, 3:45 p.m. to 5 p.m., cost \$25 per month.

Traditional all-day class includes breakfast and lunch. The after-school program includes a snack.

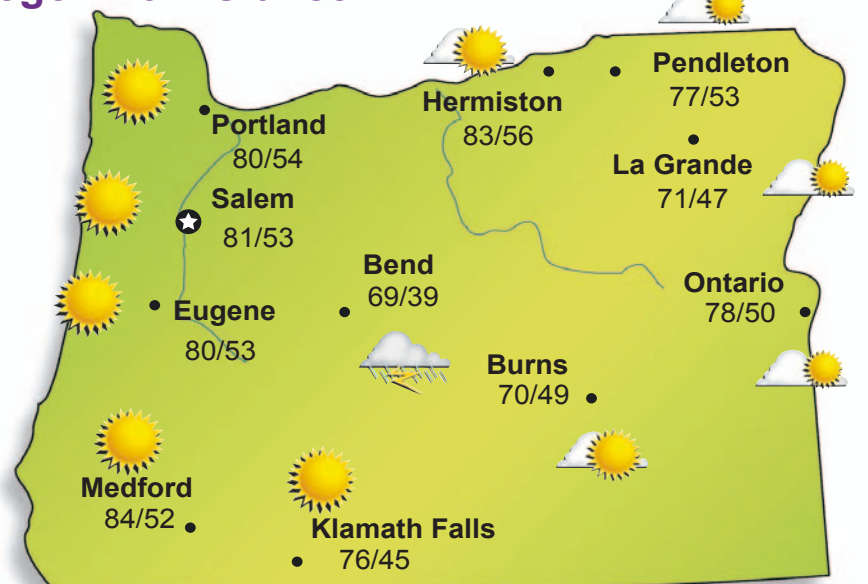

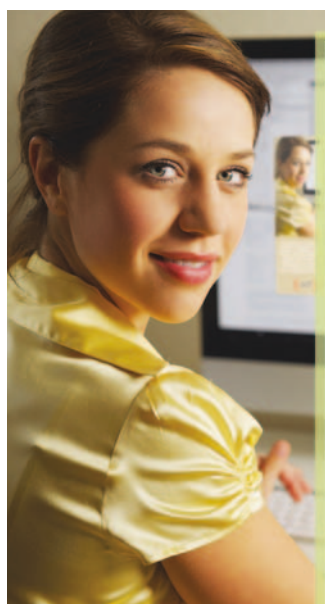
The UV Index is measured on a 0-11 number scale, with a higher UV Index showing the need for greater skin protection.
