Charles Henry 'Chuck' Fitch

Dallas, Ore.

June 4, 2015

Chuck Fitch, 100, passed away June 4, 2015, at the Dallas Retirement Village.

Charles Henry Fitch was born in San Francisco, California. His mother died when he was four years old and he went to live with his elderly grandmother in the Napa Valley, then when he was 12 he went to live with his aunt Nan Fitch Cray and uncle William H. Cray in Echo, Oregon. He had his 12th birthday May 20, 1927, on the train from Oakland to Echo and it was the same day that Charles Lindbergh flew the Atlantic. That event so impressed Chuck that it shaped his future career in airlines. He graduated from Echo High School in 1933 with honors and was active in school sports including tennis, basketball and track.

During school and after graduation he worked operating printing presses and linotype in Will Cray's weekly newspaper, the Echo News. Chuck was fascinated by radio communication and he studied for and obtained a ham radio license and an FCC commercial radio operator license. He met and dated Betty Hawkins from Dallas, Oregon, a Willamette University graduate who was an English teacher in Echo High School, and they were married in 1937 in Dallas, just after he was hired by United Airlines as a station agent in Pendleton.

In 1939 Chuck was transferred by United to Salt Lake City as a ground radio operator. In 1942 he was promoted to chief radio operator and assigned to San Francisco to work with United's domestic operations and their Pacific Military Air Transport Command. Following the end of WWII he was transferred to

United's headquarters in Denver, Colorado, as director of System Air Ground Communications. In 1948 the airlines contracted with Aeronautical Radio Inc. (ARINC), a newly formed company headquartered in Washington, D.C., to operate air-ground radio stations for all the airlines in United States-controlled air space. Chuck transferred from United to

ARINC as station manager at San Francisco. In 1950 he was transferred to their headquarters in Washington, D.C., as director-operations, which title he held until 1968 when he was promoted to vice president-operations and ARINC headquarters was moved to Annapolis, Maryland. He retired from this position in September 1977 when his wife Betty died of cancer.

After a consulting contract with the United Nations, he returned to Oregon in 1979 and settled in Dallas. In 1980 he married Veryl Bratager, a young Albany widow originally from Madison, S.D. Chuck and Veryl moved to the Dallas Retirement Village in 2011. Veryl passed away in 2013 at the age of 89.

Chuck has three sons: David (and Linda), a consulting geologist of Reno, Nevada; Michael (and Jackie), a retired United Airlines pilot of Clearville, Pa.; and Richard (and Lin), a retired high school teacher and administrator of Cape May, N.J. Chuck has a stepdaughter, Alison Warmann and family of Thousand Oaks, Calif., and stepsons Brian Bratager and family of Seattle and Mack Bratager, also of Seattle. He has seven grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren and three great-great-grandchildren.

Donald Roland 'Don' DuBois

Donald Roland "Don" DuBois was born on January 18, 1948, in Sanford, Maine, to parents Roland Eugene and Elsie Marie Leleivre DuBois. He died on June 3, 2015, at his home in Hermiston, Oregon, with his wife and sons by his side at the age of 67 years.

Don graduated from Sanford High School in the class of 1966. He joined the United States Navy in January of 1967 and served 2½ tours in Vietnam. During his third tour Don was injured and was honorably discharged in March of 1970. He received the National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal with Device and Meritorious Unit Commendation Ribbon.

Don moved to Hermiston, Oregon, in 1970 and worked for Marlette Homes then building custom homes in the Hermiston area before hiring on at the Umatilla Army Depot in 1979. While at the Army Depot he received many accommodations for his outstanding work ethic. He was on the shooting team for the Army Depot, earning many trophies for his marksmanship. Don was united in marriage to LaVonne Smith

in 1977 and helped to raise her four sons. Don was a devoted husband and father, living his life for his wife, sons, and grandchildren. Don had one dream and that dream was to spend the winters down south after retirement. God granted him that wish for 5 months before he was diagnosed with cancer and returned home to be with his family.

He is survived by his wife of 38 years, LaVonne DuBois, Hermiston, Ore.; daughter Holly Ramsdell, Illinois; sons Jerry G. Foley Jr. (Laura), Jeffrey D. Foley (Robin), and Christopher J. Foley, all of Hermiston, Ore.; 14 grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews.
