Herbert A. 'Herb' Ketelson Jr.

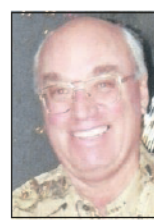

Lawrence John Wolfram, LJ, Larry or Gpa, was born in Los Angeles, Calif., on July 16, 1942, to Norman and Norma Wolfram. He died June 12, 2015, at 72 while resting quietly in his home surrounded by family after losing his battle with cancer. In 2011 Lawrence was diagnosed with colon cancer and underwent chemotherapy treatments, which were successful. In March of this year (2015) he was diagnosed with a rarer and more aggressive form of cancer, angiosarcoma. Although the treatments helped slow the growth of the cancer, they were unsuccessful at stopping it. Larry and Mary, who enjoy spending their winters in sunny Arizona, made the long trip back to Oregon in May to spend his final days in the home they had spent so many years in.

He is survived by his wife Mary; his mother Norma; his son Warren and his wife Stefanie Wolfram and grandson Damian Wolfram; his daughter Wendy and her husband Denny Christensen, granddaughter Terika Christensen and grandson Remington Christensen; five other grandchildren and five great-grandchildren; brother Leonard; sister Lynette; and many cousins, nieces and nephews.

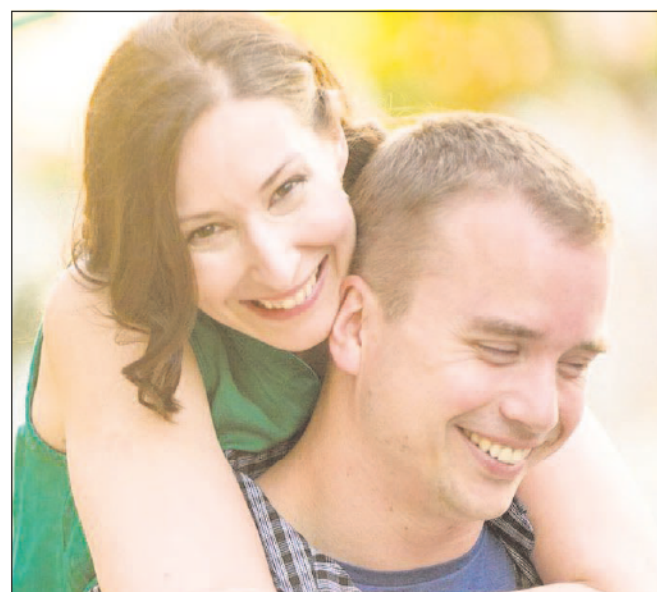

Heppner DMV will switch days of operation

Starting July 9, the Heppner DMV field office will be open on Thursdays instead of Tuesdays.

The last day that the office will be open on a Tuesday is June 30, according to information released by the Oregon Department of Transportation. It will reopen on Thursday, July 9. Business hours will remain the same: 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., with a lunch closure from 11:30 to 12:30 p.m.

The office is staffed one day a week by an employee from the Pendleton DMV

office. Because the Pendleton office is busier on Tuesdays than on Thursdays, DMV is shifting the Heppner business hours to Thursdays.

DMV successfully made the same change last fall with the La Pine DMV field office, which is staffed one day a week by employees from

the Bend DMV field office.

Before going to any DMV field office, the agency suggests that you first check www.OregonDMV.com to make sure you have everything you need for your business at DMV or to see if you can get your DMV service more conveniently online or by mail.

Common transactions such as renewing vehicle registration, changing your address and reporting the sale of a vehicle can be done online.
