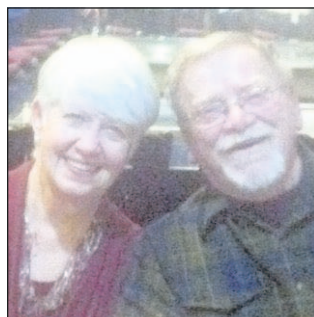

Charles Edward "Chuck" Gooding passed away at Good Shepherd Hospital surrounded by family, on Tuesday, June 16, 2015, at the age of 95.

He was born April 20, 1920, in Spalding, Idaho to Archibald and Minnie (Russell) Gooding. At age 5, the family moved to Grouse Flat (near Troy, Oregon) where he remained until age 19 when he moved to La Grande. He was drafted into the U.S. Army Air Corps, serving in Europe during World War II.

Chuck married Charlotte Holloway on July 31, 1949. They spent most of their years in Hermiston. For 20 years, Chuck drove truck for Mayflower Farms. After leaving Mayflower he began Empire Builders, working as a general contractor until 1980, and as a finish carpenter and craftsman for the remainder of his years. He ramrodded his last ma-

Barbara Ruth Meade

Hermiston September 23, 1936-June 12, 2015

Barbara Ruth Meade was born on September 23, 1936, in Caldwell, Idaho, to parents Elihu and Rae Bennett. She died on June 12, 2015, in Hermiston, Oregon, at the age of 78 years.

Shortly after her birth the family relocated to Echo, Oregon. Barbara attended Echo Elementary School where she was a member of the Echo Marching Band. Upon completing elementary school the family then relocated to Hermiston, Oregon. Barbara attended Hermiston High School and graduated in 1954.

After high school she became employed as a telephone operator in Pendleton, Oregon. Barbara then attended business school in Portland, Oregon, where she also worked part-time in a local drug store. Having completed her studies in Portland she then returned to Hermiston, where she became employed as a secretary with an insurance agency.

In 1957, Barbara met Bill Meade of Stanfield, Oregon, who would become the love of her life. In the fall of 1958, Barbara and Bill were married. They then relocated to Lynnwood, Washington, where Bill became employed with the largest volume supermarket at that time in the Northwest. While living in Lynnwood, Barbara and Bill started their family with the birth of their son David, followed four years later by the birth of their son Mitchell.

For ten years Barbara operated a private day care center that put an emphasis on a structured learning environment. During this time she became a Cub Scout den mother where she implemented various learning programs along with group leadership. One of her largest scout projects was in developing a theme for the annual banquet that centered

on famous Americans — in this case, a local mountain climber from Seattle who became the first American to climb Mount Everest, Jim Whittaker. Barbara arranged a meeting with Mr. Whittaker for the scouts to tour the original REI Co-op, which he managed at the time. Having taken photos and measurements of the original model of Mount Everest displayed at REI, her den then recreated the scale model, which was then used as the centerpiece, to much garnered attention.

In the fall of 1992, Barbara and Bill were able to realize the American dream when they purchased the supermarket in Umatilla, Oregon, where she was a bookkeeper. Having remodeled the store and naming it Columbia Red Apple Market, they operated within this format for the following 12 years. In 2008, they again remodeled the store to become Columbia Harvest Foods. Barbara again worked in the same capacity of bookkeeper, having retired in 2010.

A loving wife, mother and grandmother, Barbara is survived by her husband of 56 years, Bill; sons David Meade and wife Julie of Hermiston and Mitchell "Russ" Meade and wife Sara of Umatilla; her two grandsons, Calvin and Cameron Meade of Hermiston; her granddaughter Ashley Snow and husband Kyle of Stanfield; and her sister Kathy Cavallo of Pendleton, along with various nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents Elihu and Rae Bennett.
