PENDLETON — The following sentences have been imposed in Umatilla County courts:

FELONY

•Derick Levi Martinez, 31, Umatilla (TRCI), pleaded guilty to Possession of Methamphetamine (persistent involvement); sentenced to 6 months Oregon Dept. of Corrections, 1 year post-prison supervision and \$140 fine, plus court costs and fees.

He said a variety of other park projects are also planned:

• City officials made an offer to purchase a parcel of land from Pendleton Grain Growers across from the Hermiston Police Department near the railroad tracks for the future construction of a skate park. He said he expects to hear back from PGG soon.

• The city received \$16,800 to create ponds on both sides of the bridge at Belt Park, likely this fall. He said the funding came from Shearer's Foods, which had the option to pay a state penalty or fund a local project.

• A boiler that provides a heated shower water at the Hermiston Family Aquatic Center stopped working, so the city is considering options to replace it. He said the department also plans to fix a leak in the multi-use pool this fall.

• The city plans to construct a new entrance from East Elm Avenue to the public works facility near Sunset Park. He said, with the city's purchase of the parcel of land adjacent to

the south part of the park, the usable acreage would almost double.

• The permanent restroom for Victory Square Park has been ordered.

• A large group of Boy Scouts removed brush and litter and constructed trails at a variety of parks Friday.

• The parks committee plans to tour possible locations for more parks on the eastern side of the city during a tour in September.

inches to create a stormwater overflow retention area

during heavy rain events. The current softball field would be replaced with an all-grass multi-sport field. Parks and Recreation staff have discussed the change

with a key user group of the softball field.

Newport Park has been flooding substantially more frequently, with a May 12 storm

leading to two insurance claims against the city from the owners of flooded property. The project is expected to cost about \$45,000.
