Boat catches fire, drifts away at Hat Rock

Black smoke billowed from the Hat Rock marina Sunday afternoon when a boat suddenly caught fire at the docks and drifted into a row of trees on the opposite shore.

Umatilla Fire Chief Mike Roxbury said the boat's owner was gone by the time firefighters arrived. According to witnesses, the fire started due to some kind of mechanical failure in the engine, and two children suffered minor injuries.

Roxbury said crews were able to extinguish the blaze before it could burn up the shore and into dried grasses surrounding nearby homes.
