Couple cooks up barbecue contest win

Tri-tip recipe perfected by cooking for high school football team

Cooking for the Hermiston High School football team paid off for a local grilling team.

Mike and Deannie Simon, from team Smokin' Hot & Saucy, placed in all four divisions at the Umatilla County Fair Backyard BBQ Contest Aug. 12 and took home the top prize of a new grill.

Competing against more than 10 other teams, the couple won the beef division with a tri-tip recipe Mike Simon has had many opportunities to perfect. He said he cooked meals of roughly 100 tri-tips multiple times last year: for several Hermiston football games in the regular season and all of the postseason

"I use Spade L seasoning. You can get it basically at any grocery store," he said. "I just a tenderizer and then I smoke it really heavy for about two hours at 225 (degrees), and it just comes out perfect every time."

Simon said the key to grilling is simplicity. The type of grill used isn't particularly important either, he said. Although he now has several grills, including a four-rack trailer that can cook about 85 tri-tips

at once, he said the best he ever cooked was on a cheaper, basic grill.

Deannie Simon said the fact that she and her husband both enjoy eating helped propel them to victory. She said they started developing the recipe for their lamb meatballs about a week earlier.

"We've been eating lamb all week long," she said.

The Simons placed third in the lamb division, third in the onion division and second in the potato division

All of the contestants were provided with a cut of tri-tip, a lamb sirloin ion and potato divisions.

roast, 10 potatoes and four onions. First place in each division was awarded \$300, with second and third places receiving \$200 and \$100, respectively.

Jeff and Denise Marks, from team Conestoga, also placed in all four divisions but finished six points behind. The Marks team placed first in the lamb division, third in the beef division, second in the onion division and third in the potato division.

Winning grill entries

Overall and beef division winner: Smokin' Hot & Saucy (Mike and Deannie Simon)

Mike's Tri-tip

Ingredients: tri-tip, Spade L Ranch Beef Marinade & Seasoning. Trim fat from tri-tip. Rub with seasoning. Smoke at 225 degrees for two hours.

Ingredients: one pound ground lamb, two tablespoons dry bulgur, two cloves minced garlic, one small onion grated and drained, one tablespoon kosher salt, onehalf teaspoon pepper, one egg beaten, one teaspoon cumin, one teaspoon paprika, two tablespoons chopped parsley, two tablespoons olive oil.

Mix everything but olive oil. Make into patties and coat with olive oil. Grill on medium high five minutes per side.

Sauce: one-half cup Greek yogurt, one teaspoon cumin, one-half teaspoon cayenne pepper, one-eighth teaspoon sea salt.

Mix and chill.

Bacon Cheddar Potato Tart

Ingredients: bacon, thin sliced potatoes, whipping cream, shredded sharp cheddar cheese, sliced provolone cheese, salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder. Line pan with bacon. Layer potatoes, cheeses and a bit of cream. Sprinkle each layer with salt, pepper, garlic powder and onion powder. Wrap bacon over top. Bake at 375 degrees for two to three hours until potatoes are soft. Slice and serve.

Ingredients: onion, slice of bacon, barbecue sauce.

Cut top off onion. Peel and cut out core. Wrap strip of bacon around onion and secure with a toothpick. Fill onion with barbecue sauce. Bake at 375 degrees for two hours. Continue to coat with barbecue sauce. Cover with foil for last hour.

Lamb division winner: Conestoga (Jeff and Denise Marks)

Ingredients: lamb, Greek yogurt, red onion, green peppers, yellow peppers, red

Marinate lamb in Greek yogurt. Skewer lamb, onion and peppers. Grill kabob.

Potato division and onion division winner: Die Hard BBQ (Tim Watts, Bob Crow and Corey Ashbeck)

Bank is seeking input from people who have received emergency food during the past year in Oregon.


