The win is Hermiston's first since beating Umatilla, 2-1, on August 29. The Bulldogs (2-2-1) had gone 0-2-1 since that match, and the win Tuesday will help the spirits of a Bulldogs team that is bordering on beleaguered.

"They just kinda pulled it out from nowhere, really," head coach Danielle Turner said. "We struggled here and there throughout the whole game possessing, and just having that fire. For some reason, we just didn't come out ready to play today, and in that last minute Hannah came out of nowhere and saved us, really. It was great for her, great for us. Hopefully we'll be able to keep the momentum going into next week."

In regards to how the match started, the ending is a bit of a surprise. David Douglas dominated the first 20 minutes, sending shot after shot to junior goalkeeper Kilie Harrison. In those first 20 minutes, Douglas had 12 shots to Hermiston's two. But Harrison was stout in net, coming up with three saves when the shots weren't deflected or off target.

Then Hermiston bore down. The Bulldogs peppered Dolton with shots as the first half closed, and kept at it when play resumed after

half. Hermiston doubled the David Douglas shot attempts in the second half, and were only off target with one, though the Scots almost came away with the first goal shortly after half.

In the 47th minute off a free kick, David Douglas' Whitney Beach made a run to the near post and got off a shot that nearly sneaked past Harrison, but it deflected off her torso and out of bounds for a corner. It was one of nine corners the Scots attempted, and all were brushed aside by the Bulldogs.

As the second half wound down and the pace began to pick up, Hermiston found itself getting more long run-out chances. Senior reserve Adriana Cadenas had one in the 71st minute, and Thompson had one a minute later. But then the sophomore was finally able to trap a long pass, gain control, and find the back of the net.

For a team struggling to score like Hermiston, the late goal, Thompson said, can be something to stick in their back pocket.

"It'll definitely give us momentum for the next game," Thompson said. "We won this game, but we're gonna go to practice and keep working hard for Saturday's game."

The Bulldogs face Rex Putnam at 3 p.m. Saturday at Kennison Field.

Cove, 7-6, in a rain-soaked opener, and squeaked past Pilot Rock, 14-6, last week. Irrigon, meanwhile, has had no trouble with its first two games. The Knights opened with a 47-8 win over Riverside, then followed with the 53-0 shutout over Enterprise.

Irrigon is riding high under first-year coach Steve Sheller. They have new uniforms, a new helmet design hearkening back to the old leather strips made famous by the University of Michigan, and a new attitude.

"There's a new atmosphere," senior quarterback Nate Verley said. "We're gonna keep going. I'm a senior. I'm passing this down."

This is a test for both resurgent teams.

How can Umatilla deal with an explosive — and hot — offense?

How can the Knights deal with a big, strong, physical team up front, the likes of which it hasn't seen yet? Is Irrigon for real? Is Umatilla for real?

These are all questions that will be answered after

60 minutes of football in Umatilla.

"We said it (Monday): This week is a great testing point," Mosher said. "We knew we were gonna be OK, and if we really worked at it we'd be great. This is gonna be a great measuring stick of where we're really at."

**Football standings: Week 3**

The 2015 high school football season is two weeks old, and some trends are beginning to form across the state. In the 5A Columbia River Conference, Hood River is starting to separate itself as the only undefeated team remaining and also holding strong point differential. The Eagles have a relatively soft non-conference slate remaining before league play starts, with games against 2-0 North Eugene and Ridgeview upcoming.

In the 3A ranks, Umatilla is the arguably one of the biggest surprises in the state, jumping to a 2-0 record and sitting atop the Eastern Oregon League. Umatilla is tied with Salem Academy for second fewest points allowed, with 12, trailing Coquille/Pacific's six. Umatilla squares off with 2-0 Irigon on Friday in a true litmus test for the Vikings.

At 2A, the league is still completely wide open. Four of the six teams are 2-0, with Culver, Heppner, Irrigon and Stanfield all giving impressive early returns. The average point differential of those four teams is 78.75, with Irrigon sporting a massive plus-92. The Knights get a tough test this week with Umatilla, while the rest get easy opponents. It's not out of the question that all four could be 4-0 when league play arrives, and most of these teams meet early in the schedule.

At 1A, it's a bit more separated. Adrian, Pine Eagle and Crane are each 2-0 with large spreads, and five others
