**Football standings: Week 5**

For the second straight week, we start in the 2A Columbia Basin Conference. With league play starting this week, one of the three undefeated teams — Irrigon, Heppner, Stanfield — could lose this week, potentially shaking up the conference standings for the first time this season. The Tigers host 3-1 and hot Weston-McEwen this week in a matchup of Wing-T offenses. Stanfield's players have been looking forward to this one after a wild 53-42 TigerScot in last year's CBC opener. Umatilla (3-1) hasn't been spectacular this season, but the Vikings have been sound on their way to a winning record and positive point differential through the first month of the season. This week, the blue-and-orange clad Norsemen get Tri-Cities Prep, who has played a number of local teams already this season without any success. In two games against two CBC opponents (Stanfield and Heppner), the Jaguars lost 55-17 and 59-13, respectively. The Vikings have one more tune-up, against King's Way of Vancouver, Washington before they travel to Nyssa for the start of Eastern Oregon League play. Improvement is obvious with the Hermiston Bulldogs (0-4). Against a Lewiston team that had been playing well, you just wish the Bulldogs had gotten going before the scoreboard read 35-0. Dayshawn Neal appears to be growing comfortable, and Nathan Hunsaker is starting to contribute elsewhere other than as a back-up quarterback. After a slow start to its season, Coeur d'Alene (4-1) has reeled off four straight wins, including a 27-3 thrashing of Idaho power Highland. Hermiston is looking to average its only loss from last year, a 31-27 win in Coeur d'Alene. Echo suffered a devastating blow last Friday

against Wallowa. The blue-and-gold clad Cougars lost to the black-and-gold clad Cougars 66-22, but Echo quarterback and heart and soul of the team — was likely lost for the season with a dislocated left knee. It will be tough sledging for the Cougars now in a tough Special District 1. With four games left, Echo still has to play Powder Valley (3-1, 1-0), Joseph (1-1, 1-0), and Pine Eagle (3-1), and hosts the Badgers this week, its first game without Jensen at quarterback in two years.

its opener under T.J. Bailey in heart-breaking fashion, the TigerScots have reeled off three straight wins of at least 14 points including a

38-point win over Imbler and a 31-point victory over Mac-Hi this past Friday. Behind running back Ethan Reger and quarterback Brett Speed, Weston-McEwen has a potent Wing-T offense, similar to Stanfield's tricky scheme, that is sure to create masses of

rushing yards this Friday. "They do a lot of traps," Salas said. "So you gotta stay disciplined. If everyone stays home and does their job, we'll be just fine."

first-year Stanfield coach said of Imbler. "We got a little surprised. When you buy in to everything around you, you don't think you have to train as hard, you don't have to practice as hard, things like that. But like I said, this was good. I'm happy this happened. I'm glad my kids got a wake-up call in the beginning of the season, not mid-season."

It didn't take long for Stanfield to wake up, though. And when it did, it showed why it's a contender in the Columbia Basin Conference. Junior running back Thylor Monkus rushed for 235 yards on 21 carries and scored five touchdowns, with another coming through the air. It was his second-straight 200-yard game, and his third of the season.

But Fitzpatrick's interception on the near sideline in the first

quarter was what flipped the momentum back to the Tigers' sideline.

"It wasn't just my interception that turned the game around," Fitzpatrick conceded. "We had some huge plays. (Defensive tackle) Jared (Warren), for example, had a bunch of huge plays. We some other big linemen who made some great plays. If it wasn't for those linemen, I don't think I would've got that interception."

From there, Stanfield marched 65 yards and Grogan hit Monkus for the only passing touchdown for Stanfield and a 14-6 deficit. Then after an Imbler three-and-out, Stanfield again marched right down the field on Monkus' back, and he dove in from three-yards out to pull within one at 14-13. Another Monkus 3-yarder right before the half put Stanfield up 20-14, but Imbler didn't go away.

The Panthers got the ball with

40 seconds left, and Tandy broke free for a 39-yard score to tie things at 20 apiece. Then Imbler recovered an onside kick, but couldn't score before the half and halftime begun with a tie game.

But that was as close as Imbler would again come. Justin

Keeney broke free for a 55-yard run, and Imbler answered with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Brandon McGilvary to make the score 27-26. But this is where Stanfield pulled away. After Grogan busted a 47-yard TD scamper, Imbler fumbled the ensuing kick-off and Monkus took the first hand-off of the drive and went 49 yards for a touchdown. Just like that, Stanfield was up 39-26 and firmly in control. Monkus added a 50-yarder in the fourth quarter to ensure the result.

Now with non-league play finished, Stanfield hosts Weston-McEwen next Friday. In a wild back-and-forth game last year in Athena, Weston-McEwen took it 53-42. Fitzpatrick says it's a game they've been waiting for.

"They are one of our top competitors, for sure," he said. "They put up a big fight every year, whether we win by one or

lose by one or two. They're still a great team to go against. Now we gotta focus ahead and really step up this whole week and show up at practice every day."
