That said, Hermiston has been a quality team this year, winning its home meet, finishing second at Hood River, and showing good early stamina at the Ultimook race a few weeks ago. Hermiston's last outing wasn't the best, 22nd (boys) and 19th (girls) finishes at the Bob Firman Invitational in Idaho, but that's a loaded meet with a ton of good runners and teams. With the girls side head-and-shoulders better than last year, and the boys side still pushing forward, Hermiston is still one of the best 5A cross country teams in the state. And as they crescendo into the state meet on Halloween, so will their spot in these rankings.

Because this is still evolving, I'm going to make a brief amendment. Instead of

putting a team that could (or should) have been in the top five, instead I'm going to use this space to talk about something I enjoyed or respected or thought was noteworthy. And that this month is the Echo football team. In Echo's second game of the year, a 44-12 loss at Ione, Cougars quarterback Klay Jenson left with a hip injury thought to be serious. Head coach Rick Thew was cautious with the junior, and had a backup plan heading into their game with Harper/Huntington. Jenson ended up being cleared to play and did so in Echo's 84-6 win. Then against Wallowa, it happened again, and this time it was serious. It was a dislocated knee this time, essentially ending his season and jeopardizing the beginning of the basketball season. In three weeks, Echo lost (or at the very least thought it lost0 its quarterback, and both times was noticeably shaken by

it. But here's the part I love: They shrugged their shoulders, bowed their backs and kept playing. Wallowa was too much for the beleaguered bunch without its heart and leader, but Thew said Echo played the best any team from Echo has been that he's seen in a time in a 20-12 loss.
