

Hermiston man dies in crash, woman injured

A Hermiston man died and a woman suffered injuries Saturday morning near Paterson, Washington, when their car crashed into a semi.

Alfredo S. Rivera, 69, died at the scene, according to a press notification from Washington State Patrol. His passenger, Manuela M. Rivera, 64, of Hermiston, required an emergency flight to Kadlec Regional Medical Center in Richland, Washington.

Washington State Patrol reported charges are pending for the semi's driver, Pablo G. Cancino, 48, also of Hermiston.

Alfredo Rivera was driving a maroon 1999 Oldsmobile Bravada westbound on Highway 14 about 10 miles east of Paterson when Cancino at about 5:40 a.m. turned the semi east onto the high-

way from the entrance to Agri-Northwest. Cancino cut off the sports utility vehicle, Washington State Patrol reported, which slammed into the semi.

Washington State Patrol reported investigators did not know if the Riveras were wearing seat belts, but no alcohol or drugs were involved in the collision. Hermiston police notified relatives of the death.

HPD Capt. Johnson completes school of police staff and command

Capt. Darryl Johnson from Hermiston Police Department recently graduated from Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command.

Chief Jason Edmiston said in a press release he anticipates a variety of benefits from Johnson's attendance in the program.

"As a 2007 graduate, I know how much time and energy the program takes," Edmiston said in the release. "I was fortunate enough to attend the 11-week program in 2007, but I was completely

removed from the police department and my duties during that summer. Darryl attended the online course while still juggling his responsibilities here at work."

The program, which was implemented by the Center for Public Safety in 1983, has graduated more than 15,000 students nationally and internationally. The school provides upper-level college instruction in 27 core blocks of instruction and additional optional blocks during each session. The major topics of study include

leadership, human resources, employee relations, organizational behavior, applied statistics, planning and policy development, budgeting and resource allocation.

The Center for Public Safety was established at Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois, in 1936 with the goal of expanding university-based education and training for law enforcement professionals. Since its inception, the center broadened its original objective and now provides courses and programs in the areas of police training, management training and executive development.
