PREP ROUNDUP

The Riverside boys soccer team spent the entire offseason planning its return to the top of Special District 4, and the Pirates didn't let up when they got the chance to steal the crown back from rival Umatilla.

Riverside secured the league championship on Wednesday with a 6-0 win and netted five goals before halftime.

"I think that the good thing is we bring back the league championship to Riverside," said Riverside coach Francisco Velazquez. "We practiced a lot these last two weeks for this game because this was a big one."

Alexis Mendoza scored the first of his two goals to get things started in the first half, and Jassiel Carmona, Edgar Rodriguez and Misael Madrigal also scored before halftime.

Velazquez said Umatilla (5-5-1, 4-2 SD4) switched to a defensive-minded philosophy in the second half, which was the main reason only Kevin Madrigal was able to tack on another goal.

Adolfo Bedolla Jr. made three saves in the net.

Riverside (7-2-1, 5-0) has four games left in the regular season, and Velazquez said he felt the team showed it was playoff ready with Wednesday's performance.
