# Faaeteete, Neal win yearly honors

## CRC announces allleague teams for fall sports

In his first season at the helm of the Hermiston Bulldogs, David Faaeteete led the state title-defending Bulldogs to a Columbia River Conference championship after losing its first five games of the season and hosted a playoff game.

The league acknowledged the accomplishment, voting him the CRC football Coach of the Year. Faaeteete headlines a list that also includes senior defensive lineman Tre Neal selected as CRC Defensive Player of the Year, and 10 first team all-league selections and 23 selections in total.

Hood River Valley quarterback Dallas Buckley was named CRC Offensive Player of the Year as well as first team quarterback.

Of Hermiston's 10 first teamers, six will return next season. Wide receiver Tucker Salinas, offensive linemen Caden Caldwell and AJ Fernandez, line backer John Henry Line, safety Vaemu Ena and kick returner Mitch Brown are all juniors and set to return next season. Bob Coleman, who earned the most individual selections with three, leads the group of graduating first teamers that includes Hayden Simon and Neal.

Bulldogs quarterback/ receiver Nathan Hunsaker, who started the season as a back-up quarterback before moving to wide receiver than back to quarterback after the injury to Dayshawn Neal, was named the second-team utility player alongside teammate Jerry Ramirez, a junior. Beau Blake, a sophomore, joined Hunsaker on the second team with junior running back Brown, senior defensive lineman DJ Gossett, sophomore line backer Joey Gutierrez, and defensive backs Andrew Horn, a ler Rohrman.

For Pendleton, junior wide receiver Nick Lani, senior offensive/defensive lineman Jacob Banks, senior center Michael Swanson, senior line backer Marcus Taylor, senior defensive back Kai Quinn, and senior kicker/punter Sebaztan Corona were Pendleton's first team selections.

Quinn was also the second team quarterback, and he was joined by teammates Taylor (offensive linebacker line), junior Grant Kennedy, junior defensive lineman Jamal Vann, and defensive back

Trevor Sweet. Vann was also named as an honorable mention running back with teammates Devon Roe (wide receiver) and Cade Anderson (offensive line). Hermiston's honorable mention selections were Brady Christensen (wide receiver), senior offensive lineman Ray Agusto and junior defensive lineman Corey Mason.

### **Boys Soccer**

En route to its second

straight appearance in the 5A boys soccer title match, the Hood River Valley Eagles were joined atop the all league selections by the Hermiston Bulldogs, which won its first playoff game in head coach Rich Harshberger's seven-year tenure.

Eagles junior midfielder Noe Magana and Bulldogs senior forward Edwin Rosales were Co-Players of the Year, with Magana leading the Eagles to the top seed and a league championship, and Rosales leading the team in scoring and leading the Bulldogs to the quarterfinals.

Seniors Rosales, Enrique Leal and John Mejia, and junior Freddy Rodriguez made up the Bulldog representatives on the first team. Flavio Betancourt, a senior, and Fernando Gomez were the Buckaroo representatives.

Sophomore Bernardo Araujo, junior Ismael Arenas, sophomore Mark Mejia, senior Andy Corcuera and sophomore Antonio Campos made up the Bulldogs on the second team, while Lincoln Johnson and Drew Lunny were Buckaroos named to the second team. Senior Grant Bannister, junior Jonathan Wolotira and freshman Aiden Henderson were Pendleton honorable mentions.

#### Girls Soccer

The Hood River Valley Eagles also took the majority of girls soccer selections. Following its league title-winning season, the Eagles' Kevin Haspela was named Coach of the Year and Vanessa Silva was named Goalie of the Year. The Eagles also garnered five first team selections and eight overall.

Sophomore Lesley Risueno, junior Audrey Lincoln and sophomore Quinn Latham were Hermiston's first team selections. Junior Mikayla Akers was Pendleton's lone representative.

The Bucks, though, have several second team selections. Senior Marisol Argueta, freshman Samantha Parker and senior McKenjunior, and sophomore Ty- zie Sherman earned second Hermiston's nods. Shaelynn Gilbert, a junior, senior Ayleen Sandoval, and sophomore Hannah Thompson made the second team.

## Volleyball

Despite losing the CRC title in the last match of the year, The Dalles' Lori Cimmiyotti, a senior, was tabbed as the CRC volleyball Player of the Year for the Riverhawks. Hood River coach Scott Walker was named Coach of the Year after leading the Eagles to a big comeback to win the league title by winning in The Dalles in the season's

final match. Hermiston junior Kynzee Padilla was the only player not from Hood River or The Dalles on the first team. Senior Clarissa Nitz was named to the second team with Pendleton's Haley Greb, Shelby Greb and Lauren Roberts.
