proved too much.

Brimmer finished with 23 points, with most coming in the second half. He would've had a lot more had he not shot 0-of-10 from the free throw line in the first half. He finished 2-fo-12 from there.

For Hermiston, it was a poor night shooting but only statistically. The Bulldogs fast-paced offense worked the way it should, except layups went begging more

times than not. Hermiston shot 30.7 percent from the field overall, but 40 percent from 3-point range and just 66 percent from the free throw line.

Head coach Dave Ego had to go to his bench early when Tre Neal picked up two quick fouls, and missed most of the third quarter when he picked up his fourth a couple minutes in. He would eventually foul out.

His little brother, Dayshawn Neal, demonstrated his health coming off an ankle injury suffered

during football season. The athletic left-handed sophomore had two and-ones in the second half when he exploded around his defender off the bounce and got to the hoop for layups.

James provided the spark for Hermiston off the bench in the first half, making two 3-pointers in the first quarter to put Hermiston the closest it would ever be at 12-11. His 10 first-quarter points led all scorers, and his 15 first-half points did the same.

But Kamiakin pulled away easily in the second

half. Bailey got hot from 3 and Brimmer's athleticism and touch around the basket took a 14-point halftime lead and turned it into a 25-point lead after three quarters.

Ego praised the effort of James and Dayshawn Neal, especially at the defensive end, and was frustrated his team didn't make more shots. "Chance Flores is probably as good a shooter as we have," he said, "he just couldn't put it in the basket."

Ego stressed, though, the attitude he wants to see. "I think if we get our

heads up, get our chins up — we have too much a tendency to hang our heads," he said. "We've got to change that. The culture, the attitudes have to change before the basketball game gets better."

six times and made four to tie the Braves at 40. She then got a layup, Ramirez hit a 3, took a charge from Toure then Edmiston hit a two and just like that the Bulldogs were up 47-40. The lead ballooned to as many as 12 in the fourth quarter, but the shot clock in Washington began to cause some havoc. Hermiston couldn't get good shots at the end of the clocks and either turned

it over or forced bad shots, leading to runouts and easy Braves baskets.

“We're used to getting a 12-point lead and used to running the clock out and having people chase you and shoot free throws. You can't do that in Washington,” Hoffer said. “The let up was: we ran 25 seconds off the clock and ‘Oh no, what are we gonna do?’”

The 55-43 Bulldog lead turned into a 62-61 lead after Alexa Hazel took over. She started slashing to the basket and making tough

layups, gradually bringing back the Braves. It was her layup to cut Hermiston's lead to one, and her foul that sent Ramirez to the line with a chance to make it a three-point game with a handful of seconds left. She made one of two, and a Braves turnover all but sealed it. Ramirez was fouled after her steal and again made one of two, leaving the door cracked for Toure to send the game to overtime. Her three, which was a good look from just right of the circle, hit glass and went halfway down before spin-

ning out, sending Hermiston south with a win.
“It's the first game, of course it's gonna be rough a little bit,” Juul said. “But we pulled it through. It was good for a first performance.”
