Anna Katherine Berger Gisinger was called home on December 10, 2015, at the age of 97, at St. Anthony Hospital surrounded by family members.

Anna was the 11th of 12 children born to George D. Berger and Magdalena Dilger Berger on April 17, 1918, on a farm near Fallon, North Dakota. In 1936 she moved with her parents and younger brother to Mandan, North Dakota. She was employed at a sewing room in Mandan for 3 years.

In 1939 she married the love of her life, John Gisinger Jr., at St. Joseph's Catholic Church at Mandan. She and John made their home in Bismarck, North Dakota, following their wedding. In 1941 they moved to Hermiston, Ore., where John worked at the Umatilla Army Depot. During the Korean War Anna also worked at the Depot for 3 years.

Following John's sudden death on May 29, 1960, Anna worked at the local 25 flavor ice cream store for 4 years. In 1966 during the Vietnam War she returned to work at the Army Depot for 4 years.

Anna's hobbies included sewing, crocheting and doing crafts. She also enjoyed playing pinochle. Her family and friends were blessed with many beautiful crocheted and sewn items, which were made with much love. Over the years she traveled the world seeing things many people can only imagine.

Anna was a devout Catholic and is a member of the Catholic Daughters of America in Hermiston. She

was also a member of the Eagles Lodge in Hermiston.

Anna's greatest accomplishment in life was her family which includes daughters Deloris Gisinger and Shirley Hall along with her son-in-law Edward Hall. Also surviving Anna are her four grandchildren, Melvilee Carter, John Hall, Lisa Blagg and Kevin Hall, eight great-grandchildren and nine great-great-grandchildren, and her brother Dominik Berger.

Preceding her in death were her parents, husband John, six brothers and four sisters.

Mom, granny, great-granny and great-great-granny will be missed terribly by all who knew her. She was a loving woman who taught us all to love unconditionally.

Lewis N. Richter, 80, passed away in Bend, Oregon, on December 6, 2015. He was born in Garibaldi, Oregon, on July 14, 1935, to Mathias and Margaret Richter. Lew graduated from North Marion High School in 1954 and was voted "Most Valuable Football Player" in his junior and senior years. He served in the United States Air Force from 1954-1957 and was stationed in England, Libya and North Africa.

Lew worked as a millwright/carpenter and boiler operator from 1959-1966 at Pilot Rock Lumber Company. From there he was employed at Pendleton Fire Department from 1967-1992 as a firefighter/EMT, and was one of the first EMT-3s in Umatilla County and flew on the Life-guard III helicopter.

Hobbies were honey bees, racing pigeons and coaching Little League baseball in Pendleton for 9 years. He loved being in the outdoors with family, fishing, hunting and mushrooming. He spent hours in his garden and his yard.

Lew was a past member of the Elks, Eagles, Knights of Columbus and VFW in Pendleton and Union. He was a member of the Catholic church and served as a Eucharistic minister in Pendleton and in Union. Lew volunteered delivering Meals On Wheels and at the La Grande Senior Center.

Darrell LaVern "Vern" Marlow was born on January 2, 1932, in Pendleton, Oregon, to parents John LaRoy "Roy" Marlow and Naomi LaVelle Hadley Marlow. He went home to be with the Lord on December 10, 2015, at home in Hermiston, Oregon, surrounded by his family at the age of 83 years.

Vern was raised in Pendleton, Oregon, for a short time and then in Irrigon, Oregon, where he graduated from high school in 1950. He then attended Linfield College for a year before he joined the United States Navy. Vern was united in marriage to Elathine "Ella" Parke on October 24, 1951, in Hermiston, Oregon. He served during the Korean conflict in Guam and throughout the South Pacific on an aircraft carrier from 1952 until his honorable discharge in 1956.

They lived in Seattle, Washington, where Vern worked for Boeing as a parts inspector until 1974. They then moved to Umatilla, Oregon, where Vern and his brother John started KLWJ Christian radio station. They returned to Seattle, Washington, in 1989. Vern worked for Boeing for a few years and then for TRAMCO until retiring. Vern and Ella moved to Hermiston, Oregon, in 2010 where they have lived since.

His faith was a very important part of his life. Vern served many years as a deacon and on the church council. He was a member of Living Faith Church. He enjoyed naturopathic health, fishing, and reading.

He is survived by a son, David Marlow (Darlene), Snohomish, Wash.; daughters Joan Reeves (Barry), Hermiston, Ore., and Natalie Journot, Hermiston; brother John Larry Marlow, Irrigon, Ore.; sister Janice Eppenbach; nine grandchildren; eight great-grandchildren, with one on the way; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.
